The Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney met in regular session on Tuesday, October 19, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. in the Stickney Village Hall, 6533 W. Pershing Road, Stickney, Illinois.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees were present: Trustees Lazansky, Mares, Morelli, Schimel, Walik and Zeedyk

Trustee Schimel moved, duly seconded by Trustee Morelli, to approve the minutes of the previous regular session on Tuesday, October 5, 2010.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Lazansky, Mares, Morelli, Schimel, Walik and Zeedyk Nays: None President O'Reilly declared the motion carried.

Trustee Morelli moved, duly seconded by Trustee Mares that the bills, approved by the various committees of the Board, be approved for payment, and to approve warrants which authorize the Village Treasurer to draw checks to pay the bills, to be signed by the authorized signers, as provided for by the Ordinances of the Village of Stickney.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Lazansky, Mares, Morelli, Schimel, Walik and Zeedyk Nays: None President O'Reilly declared the motion carried.

Trustee Lazansky moved, duly seconded by Trustee Morelli to accept the report of the Department of Revenue, State of Illinois and indicating sales tax collected for the month of July, 2010 indicating the sum of \$35,656.03.

Trustee Morelli moved, duly seconded by Trustee Mares to accept the Annual Treasurer's Report for the Fiscal Year beginning May 1, 2009 and ending April 30, 2010.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Lazansky, Mares, Morelli, Schimel, Walik and Zeedyk Nays: None President O'Reilly declared the motion carried.

PRESIDENT REPORT: President Daniel O'Reilly thanked all the volunteers that made our Haunted Hayride the most attended. This was a very nice improvement. The weather was excellent. The acts were the most improved. Special thanks were given to Mary Hrejsa for her efforts. The President invited people to the meeting on November 3, at 6:00 p.m. just prior to our regular board meeting. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss the redevelopment of the Kidde Park on 42nd and Oak Park. The guest will be an architect. Layouts of the plans will be revealed. We will learn about grants that are available. Input from the community is welcomed.

CLERKS REPORT: An invitation was extended to the community to the November 11, 2010 Veteran's Day Program at 10:30 a.m. at the Veteran's Memorial site on 39th and Ridgeland. The American Legion is hosting this event and they will have refreshments after the ceremony in their American Legion hall. Please consider coming out. It is nicely done and quite sincere.

TRUSTEE REPORTS: Trustee Lazansky reminded people to vote on November 2.

Trustee Mares thanked all the volunteers and all the residents who came out for the Haunted Hayride. It was a great night. A special thank you was given to Mary Hrejsa and included her husband who came out with the Shriners. The list is too long to mention all the volunteers right now. A list will be prepared and made available later on.

Trustee Morelli moved, duly seconded by Trustee Lazansky to accept treasurer's report for the month of August, 2010.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Lazansky, Mares, Morelli, Schimel, Walik and Zeedyk Nays: None President O'Reilly declared the motion carried.

Trustee Morelli gave the fire department report for the month of September. They responded to a total of 142 calls, 80 fire and service related calls and 60 ambulance calls. In 2010 there has been a response of 1373 calls.

Trustee Schimel gave an update on the Coyote Club informing us that there was a court order issued this morning demanding that the property be demolished within 90 days. In addition, the house located at 4029 Euclid was demolished at 2:00 p.m. and completed by 5:00 p.m.

Trustee Walik thanked the volunteers for their help at the Haunted Hayride. The weather was nice. The crowd was nice. He addressed the items being collected for our Troops. He

felt that he would be extending the deadline to October 29 or 30. He hoped to deliver the products to Lisle during the first week of November.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS: Fire Chief Meyer reported that the flushing of the hydrants was completed. Training was completed at 4029 Euclid. Trustee Schimel injected that three raccoons were evicted during the demolition. Training in Bensenville is also completed. Today the fire department finished their public education at the schools. They contacted every public school in our community.

Supervisor Lopez reminded people not to rake their leaves into the streets.

Treasurer Kurt Kasnicka announced that with the election on Tuesday, November 2, the meeting will take place on Wednesday, November 3 at 7:00 p.m. That will follow the special meeting at 6:00 p.m. concerning the Kidde Park.

There being no further business, Trustee Lazansky moved, duly seconded by Trustee Walik that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which the Board adopted the motion at 7: 13 p.m.
