#### February 6, 2018

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney met in regular session on Tuesday, February 6, 2018, at 7:02 p.m. in the Stickney Village Hall, 6533 W. Pershing Road, Stickney, Illinois.

Deputy Clerk Paul Nosek was filling in for Clerk Audrey McAdams who was sick.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees were present: Trustees Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White

Trustee Milenkovic moved, duly seconded by Trustee Hrejsa to approve the minutes of the previous regular session on Tuesday, January 16, 2018.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted:

Ayes: Trustee Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White

Nays: None Absent: None

Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Torres that the bills, approved by the various committees of the Board, be approved for payment, and to approve warrants which authorize the Village Treasurer to draw checks to pay the bills, to be signed by the authorized signers, as provided for by the Ordinances of the Village of Stickney.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted:

Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Prior to the vote, Treasurer Paul Nosek provided a summary indicating the source of funds used to pay the bills and the totals to be approved.

Trustee Savopoulos moved, duly seconded by Trustee White to approve Resolution 03-2018, "A Resolution Authorizing Intervention in Property Tax Assessment Procedures".

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted:

Ayes: Trustee Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White

Nays: None Absent: None

Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Prior to the vote Village Mike DelGaldo explained that very often corporations will file Property Tax Appeals to lower the evaluation of the property. Sometimes the values could exceed \$100,000. The Village could object to the assessor that the assessment should not be lowered. The Property Tax Appeal Board requires every year that we need a resolution in place in order for his firm to defend us on these appeals.

MAYOR'S REPORT: Mayor Walik mentioned that the clerk has a cold. He announced that our new squad, #142, is in service. Public Works has their new truck in service. He spoke about the police department hiring more officers. On Thursday he is going with Trustee Savopoulos to Commissioner Jeff Tobolski's office to ask for money to repave 45th Street. The Mayor is looking for help from the county or state to fix these potholes. We have to do the Stickney side of the street and Forest View has to do theirs. Also, he is going to start conversations with our engineer and Public Works Supervisor Lopez to eventually resurface Oak Park Avenue.

#### TRUSTEE REPORTS:

<u>Trustee Torres</u> told us that she has been working on updating the Garage Sale Ordinance. There will be a Village-wide garage sale on the last weekend of July. Information will be in our next newsletter.

Trustee Milenkovic informed people about The Midway Noise Compatibility meeting. Our decibels are at 54.4 decibels. The Air National Guard is no longer at Midway Airport. The dates of future meetings will be April 26, July 26 and October 22 of this year. Additional information was provided on the indoor air quality of the replacement window issue. They took a sampling of windows from nine homes. They will continue to study the issue of the odors.

<u>Trustee Savopoulos</u> notified us that there will be a Zoning Board of Appeals meeting on February 20, at 6:00 p.m. at the Village Hall. They will be discussing various text amendments.

Trustee White gave a revenue update. He reminded people that our past administration did absolutely nothing. Through our new Mayor and our police department they are diligently working on collecting \$250,000 in tickets owed to the Village. Every time people get a ticket they have opportunities to make restitution. Some of these people owe as much as \$3,000 or \$4,000. Also, we found that we had several commercial businesses that had past due water bills in the amount of \$380,000 owed to the Village. We have collected \$280,000 of that. Trustee White then addressed the revenue the Village collected in the past year from gaming machines amounted to \$82,819. During the last two fiscal years the motor fuel municipal tax was put on. He gave credit to Clerk Audrey McAdams for giving them the idea for the board to do this. We were the only municipality not to take advantage of this. At the time it was passed, one of the trustees thought it was better to raise your property taxes. The bulk of that money comes from people who don't live here. On Cicero Avenue big trucks fill up their tanks at 500 gallons at a time. In the last two fiscal years we collected \$264,816. When we look at all the local revenue that we had of late it came to \$687,635. This is revenue we would not have had a few vears ago. This is all new revenue. This allowed us to have our new police stairs. It allowed us to hire a few new police officers. As Treasurer Paul Nosek said a few meetings ago, we are not going to raise property taxes. If it does get raised at all, it would be because of the Police Pension Fund. We will make every effort to continue to bring in new revenue so it doesn't affect you directly.

The Mayor applauded all the people involved making this happen.

#### **DEPARTMENT REPORTS:**

<u>Public Works Supervisor</u> Joe Lopez thanked the Board for the new Public Works truck. He provided snow removal protocol. Presidents' Day they will be off.

Police Chief Dan Babich thanked the Board for the Police Department's new Chevy Tahoe. He spoke at length about the graphics on the Tahoe supporting our veterans and all types of cancer by a ribbon that has all the colors for cancer awareness. He explained that the police are enforcing snow routes that we did not write tickets for during the first two snows thus giving the residents a break. Also, the police department is enforcing the vehicle boot immobilization program. He also spoke about the new candidates that will be attending the next academy. Trustee White addressed one of the new officers in the department, Officer Flannigan who came from Lyons. He has an expertise in spotting overweight trucks. So far he has generated \$25,000.

<u>Fire Chief Jeff Boyajian</u> reminded people to take one of the flyers located in the lobby that addresses fire safety. He reported on an oven fire that took place the day before. The resident extinguished it prior to the arrival of the fire department.

<u>Treasurer Paul Nosek</u> thanked Village Attorney Mike DelGaldo for his assistance with the delinquent water bills.

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There being no further business, Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which the Board adopted the motion at 7:25 p.m.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2018-<u>04</u>

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-303 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING VEHICLE LICENSES

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

**WHEREAS,** the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of Village residents; and

WHEREAS, the Village currently requires any Village resident operating a motor vehicle within the Village to obtain a Village vehicle license (the "Vehicle Tags"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities recognize the need to update the Vehicle Tag regulations (the "Regulations") from time to time; and

**WHEREAS,** the Corporate Authorities wish to eliminate the Vehicle Tag fee for residents aged sixty-five (65); and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 14, Section 14-303 of the Municipal Code, Village Of Stickney, Illinois (the "Village Code") as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

### ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

#### SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

#### SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 14, Section 14-303 of the Village Code to update and clarify the Regulations and to authorize the President or his designee to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

## ARTICLE II. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-303 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

#### SECTION 3.0. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-303.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 14, Section 14-303 as follows:

Sec. 14-303. - Fees.

(a) The annual fee which shall be paid for vehicle licenses shall be as follows:

Motorcycles, with or without sidecar ..... \$10.00

Motor vehicles which are not freight-carrying vehicles, except antique vehicles as defined in section 14-271 and recreational vehicles as defined in section 14-151.1(a) ..... 20.00

Antique vehicles ..... 10.00

Recreational vehicles ..... 40.00

Commercial vehicles, as defined in section 14-151(a) ..... 75.00

Freight-carrying vehicles, or vehicles designed to carry goods or merchandise or other articles, except for antique vehicles as defined in section 14-271 and recreational vehicles as defined in section 14-151.1(a), shall be classified in accordance with the Illinois state license required therefor:

Classification	Weight	Fee
В	8,000 or less	\$40.00
D-F	8,001 – 16,000	\$65.00
H-L	16,001 - 36,000	\$80.00
N-S	36,001 - 59,500	\$110.00
T-Z	59,501 – over	\$155.00

The horsepower and weight shall be determined in the manner prescribed by statute for determining these factors for the purpose of fixing state license fees.

(b) The There shall be no annual fee to be paid by persons of the age of 65 years or older for the first any vehicle license for motor vehicles which are not freight-carrying vehicles, antique vehicles or recreational vehicles shall be \$2.00, provided that adequate proof of age and residency is provided by the applicant. Only one \$2.00 vehicle sticker shall be available per individual applicant per year. In the event a

vehicle is jointly owned by two persons over the age of 65 years, the \$2.00 vehicle sticker shall be allocated to one individual.

- (c) Each owner or operator of such vehicle coming into possession of such vehicle after the expiration of six months of the fiscal year shall pay one-half the annual fee provided for.
- (d) Any resident of the village who has handicapped and/or disabled State of Illinois license plates and who offers adequate proof of being a disabled veteran or having been a prisoner of war shall be exempt from the fees provided for in this section.

#### SECTION 3.1. OTHER ACTIONS AUTHORIZED.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. #### **ORDINANCE NO. 2018-05**

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE II, CHAPTER 62, SECTION 62-31 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING GARAGE SALES

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

**WHEREAS,** the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

**WHEREAS,** the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of Village residents; and

**WHEREAS,** the Village currently regulates house, garage, rummage, attic and basement sales (collectively, "Garage Sales"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities recognize the need to update the Garage Sale regulations (the "Regulations") from time to time; and

WHEREAS, among other updates to the Regulations, the Corporate Authorities wish to designate the last Saturday and Sunday of July annually as a Village-wide Garage Sale; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Article II, Chapter 62, Section 62-31 of the Municipal Code, Village Of Stickney, Illinois (the "Village Code") as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

### ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

#### SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

#### SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Article II, Chapter 62, Section 62-31 of the Village Code regulating Garage Sales within the Village and to authorize the President or his designee to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

#### ARTICLE II.

### AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE II, CHAPTER 62, SECTION 62-31 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

#### SECTION 3.0. AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE II, CHAPTER 62, SECTION 62-31.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Article II, Chapter 62, Section 62-31 as follows:

### ARTICLE II. - HOUSE SALES, GARAGE SALES, <u>RUMMAGE SALES</u>, ATTIC SALES, BASEMENT SALES

Sec. 62-31. - Permit.

- (a) Required. No person shall engage in or conduct a garage, rummage, attic, basement or house sale from any residence, store, structure, or lot, in the village without first having obtained a special permit for such sale from the village clerk. No permit shall be issued unless application therefor is made no less than 14 days prior to the date of the proposed sale.
- (b) *Terms and conditions for issuance.* No special permit will be issued unless there is full compliance with the following terms and conditions:
  - (1) The applicant-permittee must be the owner of the premises where such sale is to be held.
  - (2) The sale will involve only the personal property items owned by the applicant-permittee or members of the household.
  - (3) No such sale has been conducted by the same applicant or from the same premises during the preceding 12-month period. Such permit shall be valid only for the particular sale and premises designated thereon and shall be nontransferable.
  - (4) No sale items shall be located and no sales activities shall be conducted in the front yard area of any premises, or on any public sidewalk, parkway area, or other public property.
  - (5) All sSigns advertising such sale shall may be located in the front yard area of the premises, and no such sale signs, handbills or other advertising matter shall be located or posted in or upon any public parkway, building, utility post, lamppost, or public property in the village. Notwithstanding the foregoing, signs may be posted on public parkways for not more than forty-eight (48) hours.
  - (6) The sale shall be limited to a consecutive period of not more than two days and shall be conducted only during the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.
  - (7) The sale shall be conducted without the use of outdoor loud speakers or other amplification equipment.

- (8) The sale shall be conducted in accordance with all other laws or ordinances in effect in the village.
- (9) Such permit shall be valid only for the particular sale and premises designated thereon and shall be posted in the front yard area so as to be easily seen by the public and shall be nontransferable.
- (10) No such permit shall be issued and no such person or premises shall be eligible for such permit to conduct a sale of personal items more than once during any 12-month period.
- (419) There shall be no fee charge for this special permit.
- (12) For any one calendar day, no more than two such sales shall be permitted along any street within any one block distance between two other streets. Permits for such sales shall be issued on a first come, first served basis.
- (c) The last Saturday and Sunday of July are hereby designated annually as a village-wide garage sale. No permits shall be required. All other provisions of this section shall apply.
- (ed) Penalty. Any person found to have violated the provisions of this section shall be fined not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00, and a separate violation shall be deemed committed on each day upon which a violation occurs or continues. Failure to remove signs from public or private property shall constitute a violation of this section, and violators shall be subject to a \$50.00 minimum fine.

#### SECTION 3.1. OTHER ACTIONS AUTHORIZED.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance.
