The Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney met in regular session on Tuesday, December 19, 2017, at 7:04 p.m. in the Stickney Village Hall, 6533 W. Pershing Road, Stickney, Illinois.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees were present: Trustees Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White

Trustee Milenkovic moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos to approve the minutes of the previous regular session on Tuesday, December 5, 2017.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustee Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White Nays: None Absent: None Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Torres that the bills, approved by the various committees of the Board, be approved for payment, and to approve warrants which authorize the Village Treasurer to draw checks to pay the bills, to be signed by the authorized signers, as provided for by the Ordinances of the Village of Stickney.

Prior to the vote, Trustee White amended the warrant to remove Crowley Sheppard Asphalt for \$20,000, Schaefges Brothers, Inc. for \$28,525.50 and NiCor Gas for an estimated bill for the Recreation Center for \$339.48. We had the gas turned off there. I don't want to pay this. We could have a difficult time getting it back.

Jeff White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos to remove those items from the warrant.

Trustee Kapolnek, moved, duly seconded by Trustee Torres to Pass and Approve Ordinance 2017-30, "An Ordinance Amending Chapter 46, Section 31, of the Village of Stickney regarding Police Sergeants."

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustee Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White Nays: None Absent: None Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos to Pass and Approve Ordinance 2017-31, "An Ordinance Amending Chapter 7 of the Personnel Manual Regarding Sexual Harassment for the Village of Stickney"

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustee Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White Nays: None Absent: None Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Prior to the vote Village Attorney Jessica Fese explained that this Ordinance is in relation to a public act that was passed by the state government making all units of municipal government to strengthen their sexual harassment policies. They have required us by law to do so. We have updated Stickney's Personnel Policy Manual to comply.

MAYOR'S REPORT: Mayor Walik stated that he can't wait for 2018. It is going to be bigger and better than 2017. He then gave holiday greetings. He asked people to be safe and thanked people for coming out tonight.

<u>CLERK'S REPORT</u>: Clerk McAdams gave season greetings. She reminded people that the next board meeting will be January 2.

TRUSTEE REPORTS: <u>Trustee Hrejsa</u> reported on the Christmas parties. There were approximately 50 seniors as the senior luncheon. Trustee Savopoulos made a delicious dinner for everyone. Police Chief Babich treated everyone to Weber bakery. There were approximately 100 children at the children's party. Each child got a gift and had pizza. She then thanked each volunteer for helping for the entire day from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. She also mentioned that the Village is looking beautiful with their pretty decorations. She then gave holiday greetings.

<u>Trustee Kapolnek</u> gave greetings to everyone and wished that 2018 to good for everyone.

<u>Trustee Torres</u> mentioned that she has been working with Trustee Milenkovic collecting items for the troops. Her husband and Ed Bartunek will be delivering the donations to the warehouse on Thursday morning. She also spoke about the blight inspections. They are finishing up with all the houses that have been written up. There have been a lot of improvements and court cases. There will be a little break right now and we'll probably concentrate on garbage. In the spring we will go into writing more blight. She then gave her holiday greetings.

<u>Trustee Milenkovic</u> thanked everyone that has donated items to the Operation Support our Troops and especially to Trustee Torres for her help. The Tree Committee is working on the schedule for 2018. There is some thought to the days and times to accommodate people.

Trustee Savopoulos wished everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

Trustee White gave his greetings to everyone and a better 2018.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

<u>Public Works Supervisor</u> Joe Lopez reminded people that they will be off on Friday and Monday. Pick-ups will be delayed. Christmas trees will be picked up until February.

Fire Chief Boyajian gave his greetings to everyone.

<u>Treasurer Paul Nosek</u> announced that he received the accounting software. "It will be up and running for the New Year." The auditors should be giving me their numbers. We will be reporting on that in January. We will be starting the budgeting process in January. Holiday greetings were given.

<u>Police Chief Babich</u> announced that we received the 2018 Chevy Tahoe with fourwheel drive. We will put new low-key graphics on it. He explained that the fourwheel drive is needed when and if we have serious snow and we need to help people. He then addressed a situation at 4033 Home Avenue. It is a two-story house that was boarded up by his officers, the mayor and the building department. There were people hanging out in the house. These people were from DuPage County and were using the house as a safe haven to do drugs and a hideout from law enforcement. One of the guys they took out of there was wanted out of Coal City. He was their number one guy they were looking for. We took two other guys out of there too. We boarded it up and shut it down so no one could go in there. We are working with the owners trying to rectify this. The chief told us that he has seen other places that took months to shut down. This was a hazard with the criminals and also a fire hazard. In addition, we were told that on December 22nd, 23rd and 24th officers will be doing walk throughs at the Jewel Grocery Store due to heavy shopping traffic to prevent criminal activity. Lastly, we were told that since May of 2017 until December 19, 2017 traffic and parking arrests have tripled and crime has been down thanks to all the officers and dispatchers who serve this great community. We were given an update on the four ladies that attended the last board meeting. All their complaints have been resolved. They were very happy that we came personally to their houses. We covered everything.

Chief Babich explained, "I have been hiding the star from the mayor. The Mayor has been looking for this star for a month. The Chief said, "I wanted to present it to him as the mayor." "He and I know that in our lives when you do the right thing there are a lot of people who don't want you to do the right thing. Sometimes they set you up for failure. He was not promoted on two Sergeant Exams just like what happened to me. The chief continued, sometimes it is hard to keep going and do the right thing when people keep constantly throwing logs in your way. You take a hit along the way because you are trying to do the right thing. I am glad to say that he has made it to the highest level as an official, even above the Chief of Police by being the Mayor of this Village that he worked for. I am honored to give this to him. He truly earned it. It is a beautiful star. He earned it. A lot of times you could count all your friends on one hand. It is a struggle to be a police officer or in any type of political capacity and make everybody happy. But you keep giving your heart and your soul to try to do the right thing for everybody across the board. Sometimes you want to give up because you are tired of taking the beating. A lot of people don't see behind the scenes. He admitted he himself felt that he was tired of putting out fires. He then thanked the Mayor."

Finally, greetings were given.

There being no further business, Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Milenkovic that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which the Board adopted the motion at 7:21 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-01

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING CHAPTER 2, SECTIONS 2-51, 2-76 AND 2-180 AND AMENDING CHAPTER 6, SECTION 6-2 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING SALARIES FOR ELECTED OFFICIALS

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of individuals residing in, working in and visiting the Village; and

WHEREAS, previously, the salaries to be paid to the President, the Local Liquor Control Commissioner, the Trustees and the Village Clerk (collectively, the "Elected Officials") holding office in the Village were last fixed in 2000 and since that time, such salaries have not been adjusted, altered or increased; and

WHEREAS, the positions of the Elected Officials have not been subject to cost of living or other inflation related adjustment since 2000; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Illinois Statute and Constitution of the State of Illinois, any adjustment in the salary of an elected officer of any unit of local government shall not take effect during the term for which that officer is elected; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable law, any adjustment in the salaries of the Elected Officials, as contemplated herein, shall not take effect during the current terms of the President, Local Liquor Control Commissioner, Trustees or Village Clerk; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code, the salaries for those officers who hold elective office for a definite term shall be fixed at least one hundred and eighty (180) days before the beginning of the terms of said officers; and

WHEREAS, as of the date of this Ordinance, there are currently more than one hundred and eighty (180) days before the beginning of the terms of the President, Local Liquor Control Commissioner, Trustees and Village Clerk; and

WHEREAS, in light of the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to increase the salaries of the Elected Officials and to codify the same by adopting Chapter 2, Sections 2-51, 2-76 and 2-180 and amending Chapter 6, Section 6-2 of the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney, Illinois (the "Village Code") as set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to increase the salaries of the Elected Officials and to codify the same by adopting Chapter 2, Sections 2-51, 2-76 and 2-180 and amending Chapter 6, Section 6-2 of the Village Code as set forth herein, and to authorize the President or his designee to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II.

ADOPTION OF CHAPTER 2, SECTIONS 2-51, 2-76 AND 2-180 AND AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 6, SECTION 6-2 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0 ADOPTION OF CHAPTER 2, SECTION 2-51.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by adopting Chapter 2, Section 2-51 as follows:

Sec. 2-51. - Compensation for Trustees; Insurance.

(a) The compensation to be paid to each member of the board of trustees hereafter elected shall be the sum of \$14,400.00 annually, to be paid in equal semi-monthly installments for the performance of his or her duties. The said trustees shall not be entitled to any other compensation, except as set forth in this section. However, a trustee shall be reimbursed for out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the trustee in the performance of the duties of his or her office and in compliance with all ordinances and policies of the Village.

(b) The trustees shall be entitled to a 3% cost of living increase beginning with May in the fiscal year following the fiscal year in which salary as set forth in subsection (a) was established, and in May of every ensuing fiscal year thereafter. This amount shall be added to the compensation provided above.

(c) In addition to the compensation and cost of living increases set forth above, a Trustee shall receive pay adjustments to take effect beginning in the year that the compensation about set forth in subsection (a) above is implemented and in May of each fiscal year thereafter for the duration of the term of office based on the longevity schedule set forth below according to his or her years of service as a Village Trustee and/or as any other elected officer of the Village from the time period 2000 to present. Thus, if an individual has served in any elected position, whether appointed or elected to the same, for the Village from 2000 to present, he or she shall be entitled to a longevity year for any year or partial year in which he or she has served according to the following schedule:

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by adopting Chapter 2, Section 2-76 as follows:

Sec. 2-76. – President's Compensation; Insurance.

(a) The compensation to be paid to the Village President hereafter elected shall be the sum of \$25,000.00 annually, to be paid in equal semi-monthly installments for the performance of his or her duties. The President shall be reimbursed for out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the President in the performance of the duties of his or her office and in compliance with all ordinances and policies of the Village.

(b) The President shall be entitled to a 3% cost of living increase beginning in May in the fiscal year following the fiscal year in which salary as set forth in subsection (a) was established, and in May of every ensuing fiscal year thereafter. This amount shall be added to the compensation provided above.

(c) In addition to the compensation and cost of living increases set forth above, the President shall receive pay adjustments to take effect beginning in the year that the compensation set forth in subsection (a) above is implemented and in May of each fiscal year thereafter for the duration of the term of office based on the longevity schedule set forth below according to his or her years of service as President and/or as any other elected officer of the Village from the time period 2000 to present. Thus, if an individual has served in any elected position, whether appointed or elected to the same, for the Village from 2000 to present, he or she shall be entitled to a longevity year for any year or partial year in which he or she has served according to the following schedule:

Sec. 2-180. - Compensation of the Village Clerk; Insurance.

(a) The compensation to be paid to the Village Clerk hereafter elected shall be the sum of \$34,000.00 annually, to be paid in equal semi-monthly installments for the performance of his or her duties. The Village Clerk shall not be entitled to any other compensation, except as set forth in this section. However, the Clerk shall be reimbursed for out-of-pocket expenses incurred in the performance of the duties of his or her office and in compliance with all ordinances and policies of the Village.

(b) The Clerk shall be entitled to a 3% cost of living increase beginning with May in the fiscal year following the fiscal year in which salary as set forth in subsection (a) was established, and in May of every ensuing fiscal year thereafter. This amount shall be added to the pay provided above.

(c) In addition to the compensation and cost of living increases set forth above, the Village Clerk shall receive pay adjustments to take effect beginning in the year that the compensation about set forth in subsection (a) above is implemented and in May of each fiscal year thereafter for the duration of the term of office based on the longevity schedule set forth below according to his or her years of service as Village Clerk and/or as any other elected officer of the Village from the time period 2000 to present. Thus, if an individual has served in any elected position, whether appointed or elected to the same, for the Village from 2000 to present, he or she shall be entitled to a longevity year for any year or partial year in which he or she has served according to the following schedule:

(d) The Village Clerk and his or her spouse and/or dependents shall be entitled to participate in any Village health, dental, life or other insurance programs or policies for which the Village Clerk is eligible.

SECTION 3.3 AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 6, SECTION 6-2.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 6, Section 6-2 as follows:

Sec. 6-2. - Local liquor control commissioner.

(a) *Generally*. The village president shall be the local liquor control commissioner and shall be charged with the administration of the Liquor Control Act, and of such ordinances and resolutions relating to alcoholic liquor as may be enacted. The village president may appoint a person to assist him in the exercise of the powers and the performance of the duties.

(b) *Entry powers.* The local liquor control commissioner is hereby given the power to enter or to authorize any law enforcing officer to enter at any time upon any premises licensed under this chapter to determine whether any of the provisions of the Liquor Control Act, or any rules or regulations adopted by him or by the state commission have been or are being violated, and at such time to examine the premises of the licensee in connection therewith.

(c) Compensation.

(1) The compensation to be paid to the village president hereafter elected for the performance of his or her duties as the local liquor control commissioner shall be the sum of \$25,000.00 annually, to be paid in equal semi-monthly installments. The local liquor control commissioner shall be reimbursed for out-of-pocket expenses incurred in the performance of the duties of his or her office and in compliance with all ordinances and policies of the Village.

(2) The local liquor control commissioner shall be entitled to a 3% cost of living increase beginning with May in the fiscal year following the fiscal year in which salary as set forth in subsection (a) was established, and in May of every ensuing fiscal year thereafter. This amount shall be added to the pay provided above.

(3) In addition to the compensation and cost of living increases set forth above, the local liquor commissioner shall receive pay adjustments to take effect beginning in the year that the compensation about set forth in subsection (a) above is implemented and in May of each fiscal year thereafter for the duration of the term of office based on the longevity schedule set forth below according to his or her years of service as the local liquor commissioner and/or as any elected officer of the Village from the time period 2000 to present. Thus, if an individual has served in as the local liquor commissioner or in any elected position, whether appointed or elected to the same, for the Village from 2000 to present, he or she shall be entitled to a longevity year for any year or partial year in which he or she has served according to the following schedule:

8 years	6%
12 years	10%

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 46, SECTION 46-40 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING SPECIAL POLICE

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of Village residents; and

WHEREAS, currently, the President has the authority to appoint special police during times of peril, danger, riot or pestilence or apprehension thereof, or at other times which require additional police (the "Existing Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities recognize the need to update the Existing Regulations from time to time in order to ensure the health, safety and welfare of Village residents; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 46, Section 46-40 of the Municipal Code, Village Of Stickney, Illinois (the "Village Code") as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 46, Section 46-40 of the Village Code to update the Existing Regulations and to authorize the President or his designee to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 46, SECTION 46-40 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 46, SECTION 46-40.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 46, Section 46-40 as follows:

Sec. 46-40. - Special Police.

The president of the village may, in times of peril, danger, riot or pestilence or apprehension thereof, and at all conflagrations and during any public election or celebration, or unusual congregation of the people in the village, appoint for a time not to exceed three <u>sixty-one</u> days, such special police as he may deem necessary, and during the term of service such special police shall <u>may</u> possess all of the powers and privileges and perform all the duties of regular patrol officers of the village, <u>subject to the authorization of the president</u>.

SECTION 3.1. OTHER ACTIONS AUTHORIZED.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-141 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING VEHICLE IMMOBILIZATION, TOWING AND IMPOUNDING

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of individuals residing in, working in and visiting the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney, Illinois (the "Village Code") currently sets forth certain regulations for the towing and impounding of vehicles (the "Existing Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities recognize the need to update and clarify the Existing Regulations from time to time; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 14, Section 14-141 of the Village Code as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 14, Section 14-141 of the Village Code to update and clarify the Village's Existing Regulations, and to authorize the President or his designee to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-141 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0 AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-141.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 14, Section 14-141 as follows:

Sec. 14-141. - Removal of illegally parked vehicles.

(a) In addition to Chapter 14, Division 9, the police department and all members thereof assigned to traffic duty are hereby authorized to remove and tow away or have removed and towed away by commercial towing service, any car or other vehicle illegally parked in any place where such parked vehicle creates or constitutes a traffic hazard, blocks the use of a fire hydrant or obstructs or may obstruct the movement of any emergency vehicle; or any other illegally parked vehicle which is parked in any public street or any other public place.

(b) Cars so towed away shall be stored on village property or in a public garage or parking lot and shall be restored to the owner or operator thereof after payment of the expense incurred by the village in removing and storing such vehicles.

(c) In lieu of or in addition to other remedies provided for under these codified ordinances, the police department is hereby authorized to use immobilization equipment on any vehicle found to be in violation of any of the provisions of these codified ordinances.

(1) The use of such equipment is authorized for the purpose of reducing or eliminating costs of towing, impounding and inventorying such vehicles, reducing the additional time and expense concerning the issuance of tag-on citations and the processing of the same and deterring would-be "scofflaws" from consistent violations of these codified ordinances.

(2) No person shall injure, damage or otherwise destroy any immobilization equipment belonging to the police department and attached to any vehicle.

(3) Within 72 hours of the placement of any immobilization equipment, if the owner of the vehicle does not contact the police department and the equipment in still on the vehicle, the village and the police department are authorized to tow the vehicle at the owner's expense, including the following described expenses: The cost to remove the immobilization equipment shall be \$150.00 \$200.00, plus the cost of any outstanding citations and/or traffic or parking violations, towing charges and storage fees charged by the towing agent or the village, as applicable. A \$25.00\$50.00 per day storage fee for vehicles stored on village property.

SECTION 3.1. OTHER ACTIONS AUTHORIZED.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith, including, but not limited to, the installation of any street or parking signs as contemplated herein. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE PAYMENT OF AN INVOICE FOR THE REPAIR OF THE POLICE STATION ENTRANCE BY SCHAEFGES BROTHERS, INC. FOR THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the safety of individuals on Village property, including the Police Station (the "Station"); and

WHEREAS, in connection with the foregoing, the Village previously determined that it was and is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to undertake certain repairs to the Station entrance (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, Schaefges Brothers, Inc. ("Schaefges") furnished labor and materials for the Project (the "Work"); and

WHEREAS, Frank Novotny and Associates, Inc. ("Novotny"), as the Village Engineer, has provided the Corporate Authorities with a certification that Schaefges has successfully completed or will complete the Work, and Schaefges has provided the Corporate Authorities with an invoice and a lien waiver for the Work, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Group Exhibit A (collectively, the "Invoice"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that it is necessary and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to authorize the payment of the Invoice;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1: RECITALS. The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Resolution are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Resolution.

SECTION 2: PURPOSE. The purpose of this Resolution is to approve and authorize the payment of the Invoice and to further authorize the President or his designee to take all steps necessary to carry out the terms and intent of this Resolution and to ratify any steps taken to effectuate those goals.

SECTION 3: AUTHORIZATION. The Board hereby authorizes the payment of the Invoice, authorizes the President or his designee to execute any related documentation, and ratifies any and all previous action taken to effectuate the intent of this Resolution. The Village

Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Village to such documentation as is deemed necessary. The officers, agents and/or employees of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required by the Village to carry out, give effect to and consummate the purpose of this Resolution and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. To the extent that any requirement of bidding would be applicable, the same is hereby waived.

SECTION 4. HEADINGS. The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Resolution are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Resolution nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Resolution.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY. The provisions of this Resolution are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Resolution be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. SUPERSEDER. All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 7. PUBLICATION. A full, true and complete copy of this Resolution shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall be effective and in full force immediately upon passage and approval as provided by law.
