WHEREAS, Fire Alarm Fireworks ("Five Alarm) is willing and able to provide a fireworks exhibition for the Village on Sunday, September 4, 2011, pursuant to the terms of an Agreement between the Village and Fire Alarm (the "Agreement"), which is attached hereto as "Exhibit A"; and

WHEREAS, The Village of Stickney has deemed the terms of the Agreement acceptable:

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney, Illinois:

Section 1: The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein as the findings of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney, Illinois.

Section 2: The Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney, Illinois, hereby approve the Agreement for the performance of a fireworks display in the Village on Sunday, September 4, 2011, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Section 3: Form and after the effective date of this Resolution, the President and Clerk of the Village are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Agreement, and to do all the things necessary and essential, including the execution of any documents and certificates, to carry out the provisions of the Agreement.

ORDINANCE NO. 2011-19

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14, "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC", OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS BY REVISING ARTICLE III, DIVISION 7, "STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING."

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, A HOME RULE UNIT OF GOVERNMENT AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipality in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, THE Village of Stickney seeks to maintain the safety and appearance of the streets and roadways throughout the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney maintains certain regulations of the streets and sidewalks and enforces certain regulations of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney seek to unify residential zone parking regulations within the Village.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEE OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

Section 1. Recitals. The facts and statements contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Adoption. Chapter 14 Article III, Division 7, section (g) of the Municipal Code of the Village of Stickney shall be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 14-161.1. Residential parking zones.

(g) Residential parking zone "E" location restricted hours of parking.

Effective Monday through Friday:

9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. 1:00 p.m. to **<u>4:00</u>** p.m.

Scoville Avenue (east side) from the south line of the first alley south of 41st Street to a point 200 feet south of said south line of such alley.

Home Avenue (east side) from the south side of 44th Street to the north side of 45th Street.

Section 3. Home Rule. This ordinance is enacted under the Home Rule powers of the Village as set forth in the Constitution and laws of the State of Illinois.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication in the manner provided by law.

Section 5. Conflicts. This Ordinance supersedes all ordinances or parts of ordinances directly conflicting with the terms and provisions contained herein, but only to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 7. Certification and Publication. The Village Clerk of the Village of *Stickney shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and cause the same to be published in* pamphlet form.

Please issue your permit to us in the form of a letter, not badges. With the number of girls participating, distribution of the badges is no longer possible. However, your permit or letter of approval (in a PDF format) can be e-mailed to each girl and troop efficiently from our office.

If you require a Certificate of Insurance, an updated Certificate of Insurance is automatically sent to you directly from our insurance agent on or about January 1 each year. If you need one and do not have it in your files, please let us know by checking below and we'll be sure to get that to you as well.
