Budget Hearing

This hearing is being conducted in accordance with applicable laws and is related to the Village's intent to adopt an ordinance providing for the appropriations for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2020 and ending April 30, 2021. The hearing on the proposed 2020-2021 appropriations ordinance will be held via Zoom video conferencing and with physical attendance as feasible at Village Hall 6533 Pershing Road, Stickney, Illinois, and in compliance with the most recent declaration disaster and Governor Pritzker's Executive Order 2020-44 and Public Act 101-0640. A Public Hearing of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney was called to order by Mayor Jeff Walik on Tuesday, July 21, 2020 at 6:32 P.M. via a virtual Zoom meeting.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees were present: Trustees Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White

The Clerk read the official notice of the public hearing as published in the *Landmark* Publication on Wednesday, July 8, 2020 per the certificate of publication.

The Village Treasurer David Gonzalez went over the following:

The Revenue from the General Fund for FY 2021 is estimated to be \$7,991,850. This will be a \$500,000 increase over last year. We are expecting our revenues to go down because of Covid-19. We are expecting our State Income Tax to be \$125,000 less. Our Sales Tax will be \$160,000 less. The reason why we are going to see additional money for FY2021 is the increase in permit fees for the Casino. We will receive approximately \$800,000 this year in permit fees. This is a one time hit that came at a good time because we might have seen our General Fund a lot less than last year. We cannot rely on that. We must make sure that we don't operate the Village on the \$7.9 million when we know it just associated with the permit fees. Expenditures have been in place this year, and with the loss of State Income Tax and Sales Tax, we could have been looking at \$1 million deficit. We are going to be balanced with the General Fund with the Revenues over the Expenditures by \$24,000.

The Special Revenue Funds: We are expecting \$344,000 from the Motor Fuel Fund. That money is based on our population. We are going to expend \$525,000. We are going to expend \$181,000 more than revenue. We are going to expend the reserve of \$400,000 and move it out of MFT and place it in the Capital Fund to fund our portion of the paving of 45th Street road project. The rest of that project will be paid out of the Motor Fuel Fund.

There is a separate fund that we listed this year that hasn't been there before. It is MFT-REBUILD ILLINOIS FUND. This is a special allocation that towns are receiving based on the dollar amount of the Capital Bill that was passed. We are expected to receive \$140,000 during the next Fiscal Year. It can only be used for road related projects. We wanted to keep it separate from MFT.

In the CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND, we are budgeting \$767,860. The main project out of Capital Projects this year is the 45th Street Project. That is going to be paid out of a Cook County Grant that we received for \$250,000. Forest View will pay their portion and Stickney will pay theirs. The portion that Stickney must pay is \$200,000. We will take that money from MFT and put it in Capital Projects. Therefore, we will not have to take it out of the General Fund.

The BOND AND INTEREST is our annual payment. It will be \$833,100. We will be getting these funds from the tax money. Those collections may come in slower than anticipated. The August 1 due date for the property taxes was extended.

The WATER FUND will see the revenue at \$3,858,500 with expenditures at \$3,461,100. There will be \$397,400 invested back into the infrastructure of the water system.

In discussion with the Mayor and the Finance Chairman, we know it is going to be a tough year. We limited the Capital expenditures for each of the departments. There were very little requests other than the 45th Street Project. Even though we know there will be money coming in because of the permit fees, we will not spend that money until we know it is in the bank. There could be delays in constructions. Capital is very limited this year. The Mayor asked that the budget be balanced. We balanced it in a way that we feel will keep providing the services the residents are used to. This way they will not see the effects of the Pandemic. We were able, with the help of all the department heads, to have a balanced budget but not to see an elimination of the services the residents are used to.

Treasurer David Gonzalez asked if there were any questions from the Board: There were no questions.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: There were no questions or comments

There being no further business, Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos, that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which said Board of Trustees adopted the motion unanimously at 6:45 p.m. and Mayor Walik declared the motion carried and the meeting adjourned.

<u>CLERK'S REPORT</u>: Information was provided pertaining to the Census. As of this morning our self-response rate was at 72.4%.

Trustee Reports:

<u>Trustee Savopoulos:</u> He thanked the Mayor for supporting our troops. The Trustee will match the Mayor's donation to help our troops.

Trustee Milenkovic: He notified us that he received notice from the Arbor Day Foundation informing us that we attained Tree City USA status again. He thanked everyone on the Tree Board. ORDINANCE NO. 2020-16

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-120 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING STOP STREETS.

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of Village residents; and

WHEREAS, the Village operates and maintains a road network as part of its municipal function; and

WHEREAS, traffic control is an essential part of the operation of the road network; and

WHEREAS, currently, there are no traffic control devices for northbound and southbound traffic on Kenilworth Avenue, which is a two-way street, and eastbound and westbound traffic on 44th Street, which is also a two-way street, at the intersection of Kenilworth Avenue and 44th Street (the "Intersection"); and

WHEREAS, in order to provide for the safe movement of vehicular and pedestrian traffic, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to require all vehicles approaching the Intersection must come to a complete stop; and

WHEREAS, it is understood that additional steps need to be taken to ensure that the traffic control signs are properly installed and maintained at the Intersection; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 14, Section 14-120 of the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney, Illinois (the "Village Code") as set forth below:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 14, Section 14-120 of the Village Code to require vehicles to come to a complete stop at the Intersection and to authorize the President or his designee to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-120 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-120.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 14, Section 14-120 by underlining and bolding any new language, and striking through any removed language, as follows:

Sec. 14-120. – Stop Streets.

- (a) Except when directed to proceed by a police officer or traffic-control signal, every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop intersection indicated by a stop sign shall stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersections, or if none, then at the point nearest the intersecting roadway where the driver has a view of approaching traffic on the intersecting roadway before entering the intersection. After having stopped, the driver shall yield the right-of-way to any vehicle which has entered the intersection from another roadway or which is approaching so closely on the roadway as to constitute an immediate hazard during the time when the driver is moving across or within the intersection, but said driver having so yielded may proceed at such time as a safe interval occurs.
- (b) The following are hereby designated as stop entrances:

Street or Avenue	Entrance at Which Stop Is To Be Made
Clarence Avenue and 40 th Street	Southbound, Eastbound and Westbound
Clarence Avenue and 41st Street	Southbound
Clinton Avenue and Pershing Road	Northbound

ORDINANCE NO. 2020- 17

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14, ARTICLE III, DIVISION 7, SECTION 14-161.1 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING RESIDENTIAL PARKING ZONES.

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970, and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of Village residents; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that Chapter 14, Article III, Division 7, Section 14-161.1 of the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney (the "Village Code") regarding the hours for certain residential parking zones needs to be amended to prohibit non-residents, or their approved guests, from parking in certain designated areas to address the concerns of residents related to the parking congestion in certain designated residential areas; and

WHEREAS, the designation of certain areas as residential parking and regulation and enforcement of same is a valid exercise of the police powers held by the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities desire to exercise their home rule authority in implementing the regulations contemplated herein (the "Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 14, Article III, Division 7, Section 14-161.1 of the Village Code related to residential parking zones, as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 14, Article III, Division 7, Section 14-161.1 of the Village Code related to residential parking zones as provided for herein and to authorize the President or his designee to take all action necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II.

AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, ARTICLE III, DIVISION 7, SECTION 14-161.1 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, ARTICLE III, DIVISION 7, SECTION 14-161.1.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 14, Article III, Division 7, Section 14-161.1 as follows:

Sec. 14-161.1. – Residential parking zones.

- (a) Establishment of zones. There are hereby designated residential parking zones as set forth in subsections (f), (g), (h) and (k) of this section.
- (b) Permit decals required. A resident of the village shall, upon request, be furnished with a decal bearing the words, "Stickney Resident Parking Permit." Such decal shall also have, with its borders, a designation of the parking zone corresponding to the zone in which the requesting person resides. Decals issued hereunder shall be affixed, in accordance with the instructions printed thereon which are made part hereof, immediately above the vehicle license.
- (c) Permits, decals, application. Certain parking spaces shall be designated by signs indicating zone-resident parking only. When such official signs are erected, parking shall be restricted to service or delivery vehicles whose operators are doing business with residents of the zone, and to vehicles displaying resident or visitor parking permits. All such spaces shall be designated as tow zones. Resident permits to park in such spaces are available to residents residing on properties adjacent to the applicable zone upon application to the village collector or a form to be provided for this purpose, which application shall include the name, address, telephone number of the applicant and vehicle tag number. Resident parking permits shall be in decal form and in colors designated by the village collector and shall be numbered. Such permits shall be affixed to the windshields of vehicles directly above the current vehicle license where they may be visible from the exterior of the vehicle.
- (d) Visitor parking placards. Residents of the village shall, upon request, be furnished with a maximum of two cards bearing the words "Stickney Visitor Parking Placard."
- (e) Exceptions. This section does not apply to the parking of an ambulance, emergency vehicle of any mental agency, repair vehicle of any public utility or village-owned vehicle, when such vehicle is being used in the performance of emergency duties.
- (f) Residential parking zone "W" locations. Effective at all times (24 hours per day):

The north side of 41st Street from Harlem Avenue to Wisconsin Avenue.

The north side of 41st Street from Wisconsin Avenue to Home Avenue.

The east and west sides of Maple Avenue from 41st Street to 43rd Street 45th Street.

The east and west sides of Wisconsin Avenue from 41st Street to 43rd Street.

SECTION 3.1. OTHER ACTIONS AUTHORIZED.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance, and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4. HEADINGS.

- **WHEREAS**, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

- WHEREAS, Lauterbach & Amen, LLP ("Lauterbach") has provided the Village with an agreement, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, whereby Lauterbach will provide the Services to the Village (the "Agreement"); and
- **WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the Village to enter into the Agreement with Lauterbach for the Services; and
- **WHEREAS**, the President is authorized to enter into and the Village Attorney (the "Attorney") is authorized to revise agreements for the Village making such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the President and the Attorney;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:
- **SECTION 1: RECITALS.** The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Resolution are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Resolution.

We are pleased to confirm our understanding of the services we are to provide the Village of Stickney, Illinois for the years ended April 30, 2020 and April 30, 2021. We will audit the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information, including the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the basic financial statements of the Village as of and for the years ended April 30, 2020 and April 30, 2021. Accounting standards generally accepted in the United States of America provide for certain required supplementary information (RSI), such as management's discussion and analysis (MD&A), to supplement the Village's basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. As part of our engagement, we will apply certain limited procedures to the Village's RSI in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. These limited procedures will consist of inquiries of management regarding the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We will not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance. The following RSI is required by generally accepted accounting principles and will be subjected to certain limited procedures, but will not be audited: management's discussion and analysis, the budgetary comparison schedules, pension plan employer contribution schedules, changes in the employer's net pension liability schedules, pension plan investment return schedules, and schedule of changes in employer's total OPEB liability.

We have also been engaged to report on supplementary information other than RSI that accompanies the Village's financial statements. We will subject the following supplementary information to the auditing procedures applied in our audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and will provide an opinion on it in relation to the financial statements as a whole: combining and individual

fund statements and budgetary comparison schedules, and other information listed as supplemental schedules.

Audit Objective

The objective of our audit is the expression of opinions as to whether your basic financial statements are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles and to report on the fairness of the supplementary information referred to in the second paragraph when considered in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole. Our audit will be conducted in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and will include tests of the accounting records and other procedures we consider necessary to enable us to express such opinions. We will issue a written report upon completion of our audit of the Village's financial statements. Our report will be addressed to the Honorable President and Board of Trustees of the Village. We cannot provide assurance that unmodified opinions will be expressed. Circumstances may arise in which it is necessary for us to modify our opinions or add emphasis-of-matter or other-matter paragraphs. If our opinions on the financial statements are other than unmodified, we will discuss the reasons with you in advance. If, for any reason, we are unable to complete the audit or are unable to form or have not formed opinions, we may decline to express opinions or may withdraw from this engagement.

Audit Procedures – General

An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements; therefore, our audit will involve judgment about the number of transactions to be examined and the areas to be tested. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. We will plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable rather than absolute assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement, whether from (1) errors, (2) fraudulent financial reporting, (3) misappropriation of assets, or (4) violations of laws or governmental regulations that are attributable to the government or to acts by management or employees acting on behalf of the government.

Because of the inherent limitations of an audit, combined with the inherent limitations of internal control, and because we will not perform a detailed examination of all transactions, there is a risk that material misstatements may exist and not be detected by us, even though the audit is properly planned and performed in accordance with U.S. generally accepted auditing standards. In addition, an audit is not designed to detect immaterial misstatements, or violations of laws or governmental regulations that do not have a direct and material effect on the financial statements. However, we will inform the appropriate level of management of any material errors, any fraudulent financial reporting, or misappropriation of assets that come to our attention. We will also inform the appropriate level of management of any

violations of laws or governmental regulations that come to our attention, unless clearly inconsequential. Our responsibility as auditors is limited to the period covered by our audit and does not extend to any later periods for which we are not engaged as auditors.

Audit Procedures – General (Continued)

Our procedures will include tests of documentary evidence supporting the transactions recorded in the accounts, and may include tests of the physical existence of inventories, and direct confirmation of receivables and certain other assets and liabilities by correspondence with selected individuals, funding sources, creditors, and financial institutions. We will request written representations from your attorneys as part of the engagement, and they may bill you for responding to this inquiry. At the conclusion of our audit, we will also require certain written representations from you about the financial statements and related matters.

Audit Procedures – Internal Control

Our audit will include obtaining an understanding of the Village and its environment, including internal control, sufficient to assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements and to design the nature, timing, and extent of further audit procedures. An audit is not designed to provide assurance on internal control or to identify deficiencies in internal control. Accordingly, we will express no such opinion. However, during the audit, we will communicate to management and those charged with governance internal control related matters that are required to be communicated under AICPA professional standards.

Audit Procedures - Compliance

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement, we will perform tests of the Village's compliance with the provisions of applicable laws, regulations, contracts, and agreements. However, the objective of our audit will not be to provide an opinion on overall compliance and we will not express such an opinion.

Other Services

We will also assist in preparing the financial statements and required audit adjustments, if any, for the Village in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles based on information provided by you. We will perform these services in accordance with applicable professional standards. The other services are limited to the financial statements previously defined. We, in our sole professional judgement, reserve the right to refuse to perform any procedure or take any action that could be construed as assuming management responsibilities.

Management Responsibilities

Management is responsible for designing, implementing, and maintaining effective internal controls relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, including monitoring ongoing activities; for the selection and application of accounting principles; and for the preparation and fair presentation in the financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.

Management Responsibilities (Continued)

Management is also responsible for making all financial records and related information available to us and for the accuracy and completeness of that information. You are also responsible for providing us with (1) access to all information of which you are aware that is relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements, (2) additional information that we may request for the purpose of the audit, and (3) unrestricted access to persons within the government from whom we determine it necessary to obtain audit evidence.

Your responsibilities include adjusting the financial statements to correct material misstatements and confirming to us in the management representation letter that the effects of any uncorrected misstatements aggregated by us during the current engagement and pertaining to the latest period presented are immaterial, both individually and in the aggregate, to the financial statements taken as a whole.

You are responsible for the design and implementation of programs and controls to prevent and detect fraud, and for informing us about all known or suspected fraud affecting the government involving (1) management, (2) employees who have significant roles in internal control, and (3) others where the fraud could have a material effect on the financial statements. Your responsibilities include informing us of your knowledge of any allegations of fraud or suspected fraud affecting the government received in communications from employees, former employees, regulators, or others. In addition, you are responsible for identifying and ensuring that the government complies with applicable laws and regulations.

You are responsible for the preparation of the supplementary information in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. You agree to include our report on the supplementary information in any document that contains and indicates that we have reported on the supplementary information. You also agree to make the audited financial statements readily available to users of the supplementary information no later than the date the supplementary information is issued with our report thereon.
