Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

MAYOR'S REPORT: The Mayor told us that he and Police Chief Sassetti welcomed back the kids to Home School today by grilling hot dogs for them. He asked people to watch out for children crossing the streets as they travel to and from school. Those people who live near Haley Park will see the LED lighting. There is one more on order. It is an amazing difference. This one is guaranteed for five to seven years. An update was given on the walking path on 41st and Ridgeland. It will be very nice when Public Works is finished.

CLERK'S REPORT: The clerk provided information concerning the 2020 Census data. The preliminary population Census count for April 1, 2020, is 7,110. The official Census count from April 1, 2010, was 6,786. Therefore, Stickney saw a population increase of 324 more people. The final data at the tract level will not be available until September. People were told that revenue distributed to municipalities is based on population. This includes the following: Portion of state income tax; Motor Fuel Tax; State Use Tax.

TRUSTEE REPORTS:

<u>Trustee Hrejsa</u> reminded us of the Village-Wide Shredding event on August 21, at 41st and Ridgeland from 9:00 a.m. to Noon.

Trustee Kapolnek gave information concerning the Saint Pius Church annual yard sale on August 28. The sale will be closing 43rd Street from Grove Avenue to Oak Park Avenue. The Trustee will be passing out a letter to the people who live in the immediate area that the street will be closed from 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The library will also be involved in the sale. Trustee White will be promoting this on the electronic sign.

<u>Trustee Torres</u> talked about Family Day on September 5th from 2:00 to 9:00. Various activities and menu items were given. Fireworks will be after the last band.

Trustee Milenkovic informed us that the West Suburban Chamber of Commerce is holding a job fair at the MAX in McCook on August 20th, 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Fifty companies will be there. Also, the Cook County Board of Review is open for pre-filing of property tax appeals. An appointment is needed at the Stickney Township Assessor's Office.

<u>Trustee Savopoulos</u> reported that there were some curbs on 43rd between Ridgeland and Elmwood that had to be cut out for ADA compliance.

<u>Trustee White</u> asked people to make a conscience effort to comply with whatever rules happen to be going forward. Chicago has already mandated that masks must be worn indoors. The Governor has usually followed the Chicago rules in the past. We don't know what is going to happen here with our meetings. We might have to go back on Zoom. It will not be a light decision. We will do whatever will be best for everybody. The Mayor added that we will be going week to week on where we are at. He hates to take a step back.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

<u>Public Works Director Joe Lopez</u> explained that they are working on the walking park. The spray gun gets clogged with the paint they are using. Next month they will start tree trimming.

Fire Chief leff Boyajian an update was given on the new ambulance.

<u>Police Chief Jim Sassetti</u> informed us that we are waiting for approval from ComEd to drop a power source to the license plate reader cameras.

There being no further business, Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which the Board adopted the motion at 7:26 p.m.

RESOLUTION NO. <u>15</u>-2021

A RESOLUTION AWARDING THE BID TO THE LOWEST RESPONSIVE AND RESPONSIBLE BIDDER TO LINDAHL BROTHERS, INC. FOR 2021 STREET RESURFACING PROJECT, FOR THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

- WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and
- **WHEREAS,** Article VII, Section 10(a) of the Illinois Constitution authorizes units of local government to contract or otherwise associate with individuals, associations, and corporations in any manner not prohibited by law or by ordinance; and
- WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the general welfare of the Village and its residents; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Village is in need of certain street resurfacing in the Village identified as MFT Section No. 21-00061-00-RS (the "Work"); and
- **WHEREAS,** the Village, by and through its contracted engineers Novotny Engineering ("Novotny"), sought bids from qualified companies to perform the Work; and
- WHEREAS, Novotny collected competitive bids and found that the lowest responsive and responsible bidder is Lindahl Brothers, Inc. ("Lindahl") and Novotny presented a recommendation to award the bid to Lindahl (see attached "Exhibit A"); and
- WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the Village to accept the bid from Lindahl pending successful negotiations for a contract or agreement for Lindahl to perform the Work for the Village (the "Bid");
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:
- **SECTION 1: RECITALS.** The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Resolution are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Resolution.
- **SECTION 2: PURPOSE.** The purpose of this Resolution is to accept the Bid from and award the Bid to Lindahl pending successful negotiations for a contract or agreement for Lindahl to perform the Work for the Village.
- **SECTION 3: AUTHORIZATION.** The Bid is hereby accepted and awarded to Lindahl pending successful negotiations for a contract or agreement for Lindahl to perform the Work for the Village. The Village Board hereby authorizes and directs the President or his designee to

negotiate a contract or agreement with Lindahl for presentment to the Corporate Authorities for approval at a later date. The Village Board further authorizes the President or his designee to execute any and all additional documentation that may be necessary to carry out the intent of this Resolution. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign any documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Resolution. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out and give effect to this Resolution and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The Village Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Village to such documentation as is deemed necessary. The Corporate Authorities hereby ratify any previous actions taken to effectuate the goals of this Resolution.

SECTION 4: HEADINGS. The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Resolution are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Resolution nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Resolution.

SECTION 5: SEVERABILITY. The provisions of this Resolution are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Resolution be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 6: SUPERSEDER. All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 7: PUBLICATION. A full, true and complete copy of this Resolution shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall be effective and in full force immediately upon passage and approval as provided by law.

Enclosed is the "Tabulation of Bids" for the bids that were received and opened for the above-captioned project at 10:00 a.m. on August 30, 2021. Five (5) bids were received and verified, with one computational error found and corrected. This correction did not affect the resultant low bidder.

The low bidder was Lindahl Brothers Inc., submitting a bid in the amount of \$290,599.64, which was \$2,511.61 (0.86%) below the Engineer's Estimate of \$293,111.25.

Lindahl Brothers Inc. is qualified to perform this work. Therefore, we recommend that the Contract be awarded to Lindahl Brothers Inc., 622 E. Green St., Bensenville, IL 60106, in the amount of \$290,599.64.

Note: This project will be funded by a combination of Motor Fuel Tax (MFT), Rebuild Illinois, and IL DCEO Funds.
