<u>MAYOR'S REPORT:</u> The Mayor thanked everyone for attending our meeting. Also, our Department Heads for attending especially with all the exciting events going on.

CLERK'S REPORT: She reported on a notice she received from the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago. It was a Notice of Noncompliance on Koppers Incorporated. An analysis of samples of waste discharged from Koppers were not in compliance with their requirements. They found Phenanthrene in the samples. Phenanthrene is found in coal tar and used in dyestuff, insecticides and wood preservatives.

TRUSTEE REPORTS:

TRUSTEE Hrelsa: The next Parks & Recreation meeting will be August 15, 2023. The Police open house will be this weekend. There may be a clown there.

Trustee Milenkovic: Trustee Milenkovic attended the Midway Noise Compatibility Commission on July 27th at the Mayfair on Archer. The average operation per day at Midway is 646. The average nightly operation is 108. The most common plane is the B737. There are 434 operations per day and 90 per night. Our permanent noise monitor is located at 4308 Wenonah. During the second quarter of 2023 our decibel level was at 54.1. The second quarter of 2022 our decibel level was 55. The noise level was reduced slightly. Our 12-month average was 52.6 decibels. The total noise complaints for this quarter were 1,357. There was one complaint from Stickney. Then the Trustee displayed a Village of Stickney Trivette that donated it to our Stickney Visitor Center.

The Mayor asked the Trustee if there were more trees coming up. Our arborist (Bluders) was surveying areas where trees need to be replaced. The next tree meeting will be after the applications for trees are final.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

<u>Public Works Director Joe Lopez:</u> There will be a shredding event on August 19, 2023 for Stickney residents only at 41st and Ridgeland at the Pavilion. They will be getting their driveway tomorrow.

<u>Fire Chief Jeff Boyajian</u>: The remodeled kitchen in the fire house is finally finished. The light installation for the ATV has been scheduled. The skid that goes on the back for patient transportation is on back order until September 14.

<u>Police Chief James Sassetti</u>: He reminded people of the police department's open house on August 5, 2023 11:00 to 2:00. We will have station tours. See what is happening with the police. There will be K-9 demonstrations. They will be giving free hot dogs. It's for the whole family. There will be a clown.

There being no further business, Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Milenkovic that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which the Board adopted the motion at 7:23 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-16

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-109 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING RIGHT TURN REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of Village residents; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that Chapter 14, Section 14-109 of the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney (the "Village Code") should be amended regarding hours during which right turns shall be prohibited on certain streets; and

WHEREAS, traffic enforcement on Village streets is a valid exercise of the police powers held by the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities desire to exercise their home rule authority in implementing the regulations contemplated herein (the "Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 14, Section 14-109 of the Village Code regarding hours during which right turns shall be prohibited on certain streets, as set forth below:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 14, Section 14-109 of the Village Code regarding hours during which right turns shall be prohibited on certain streets as provided for herein and to authorize the President or his designee to take all action necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance, including the installation of necessary street signs.

ARTICLE II.

AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-109 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-109.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 14, Section 14-109 as follows:

Sec. 14-109. - No right turn, 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. during specified hours.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for the operator of any motor vehicle to turn right from a northbound direction along Harlem Avenue at the intersections of 44th Street, 43rd Street, or 42nd Street between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., Monday through Friday.
- (b) It shall be unlawful for the operator of any motor vehicle to turn right from a northbound direction onto 41st Street between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.
- (c) It shall be unlawful for the operator of any motor vehicle to turn right from a northbound direction onto 40th Place between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.

SECTION 3.1. OTHER ACTIONS AUTHORIZED.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance, and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance and to install any necessary signage in accordance with this Ordinance.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4. HEADINGS.

The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. SUPERSEDER.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 7. PUBLICATION.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be effective ten (10) days after its passage and approval in accordance with Illinois law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-17

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 18, SECTION 18-325 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING FENCING

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret, and amend its ordinances, rules, and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of Village residents; and

WHEREAS, currently, the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney, Illinois (the "Village Code") regulates fencing height (the "Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities recognize the need to update and clarify the Regulations from time to time; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Regulations as set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 18, Section 18-325 of the Village Code as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 18, Section 18-325 of the Village Code to update and clarify Regulations related to fencing and to authorize the President or his designee to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 18, SECTION 18-325 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 18, SECTION 18-325.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution, or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 18, Section 18-325, which Section shall be amended as follows:

Sec. 18-325. - Height.

- (a) *In general.* No fence shall be allowed or erected in the village which exceeds five feet in height, except as otherwise provided in this chapter. An additional one foot of decorative open trellis design may be erected atop a solid design fence to achieve a total height not to exceed five six feet. All heights in this section shall include any decorative top.
- (b) Rear lot lines. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, fences along rear lot lines in all zoning districts may be erected to a height not to exceed six feet.
- (c) Residential lots adjacent to business, commercial or industrial districts. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, fences on residential lots adjacent to a business, commercial, business or industrial district, residential lots adjacent to Pershing Road or Harlem Avenue, and residential lots adjacent to a "T" alley in a residence district, may be erected to a height not to exceed six feet.
- (d) Residential corner lots. Fences along the sidewalk side of a residential corner lot may be erected to a height not to exceed six feet. A fence or gate connecting a sidewalk side fence to the residence or the garage may also be erected at the same height.

SECTION 3.1. OTHER ACTIONS AUTHORIZED.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4. HEADINGS.

The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. SUPERSEDER.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules, and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 7. PUBLICATION.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be effective and in full force immediately upon its passage, approval and publication in accordance with applicable law.
