The Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney met in regular session on Tuesday, October 3, 2017, at 7:00 p.m. in the Stickney Village Hall, 6533 W. Pershing Road, Stickney, Illinois.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees were present: Trustees Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White

Trustee Milenkovic moved, duly seconded by Trustee Hrejsa to approve the minutes of the previous Regular Session held on September 19, 2017.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustee Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White Absent: None Nays: None Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos that the bills, approved by the various committees of the Board, be approved for payment, and to approve warrants which authorize the Village Treasurer to draw checks to pay the bills, to be signed by the authorized signers, as provided for by the Ordinances of the Village of Stickney.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustee Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White Absent: None Nays: None Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Prior to the vote, Treasurer Paul Nosek provided a summary indicating the source of funds used to pay the bills and the totals to be approved.

Prior to introducing the resolution, Mayor Walik explained that Ken Palivka of our Fire and Police Commission had to step aside. We have a nice plaque here for him thanking him for his service appointed; May 2012 through October 2017. The Mayor asked Al Kulaga to step forward. Village Attorney Mike Del Galdo proceeded to swear him in to office.

Trustee Savopoulos moved, duly seconded by Trustee Hrejsa to grant permission to the Stickney-Forest View Lions Club to conduct their Fifth Annual Charity 5K Run on Sunday, September 23, 2018 at 8:00 a.m. and also to grant a waiver for usage fees for the pavilion.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustee Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White Absent: None Nays: None Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Kapolnek to grant permission to The Salvation Army to conduct their Red Kettle Campaign in front of private businesses November 1, 2017 to December 23, 2017

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustee Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White Absent: None Nays: None Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Discussion and possible final action regarding the ratification of waiving the fee for Class I liquor licenses for Saint Pius X Catholic Church special events held on September 21, 2017 and waiving the fee for Class I and J liquor license fees upon a majority vote of the Board.

Discussion and possible final action regarding the ratification of waiving the fee for a Class I liquor license for Saint Pius X Catholic Church special event held on September 21, 2017 and waiving the fee for Class I liquor licenses for Saint Pius X Catholic Church special events to be held on October 12, 2017, November 16, 2017 and December 21, 2017.

Village Attorney Mike Del Galdo said, "If there is going to be a motion to approve, the motion should include the waiver for all those dates. If you do not want to approve all those dates, you could break them out separately. The agenda just states September 21. The dates the mayor read into the record are all the dates seeking a waiver.

Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos for the waiver for September 21, October 12, November 16 and December 21, 2017.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustee Hrejsa, Kapolnek, Milenkovic, Savopoulos, Torres and White Absent: None Nays: None Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

MAYOR'S REPORT: Mayor Walik they are working on the parking area near the fire department. They have cut the curb. They will pour a sidewalk for a handicap walkway for the fire house, public works and any special events we are going to have on 43rd and Ridgeland. They are also going to pour a curb by the police department. The landscaping blocks in the area where they are going to redo the lot, every few years they have to fix them. They are going to fix the drainage and pour a curb there to hold the rocks back. The mayor mentioned the traffic detail. They are doing an outstanding job. These cars are in town speeding, wrong way, left turns, and stop signs. He spoke to one officer who at 41<sup>st</sup> and Home had six people blow through a stop sign in one hour. This is due to the Harlem construction. They are doing an amazing job. We were informed that Cory from Com Ed notified him that we are going to get a credit for \$13,854.13 for our led lighting around town. Trustee Savopoulos and Trustee White set that program up. Lastly, the mayor notified us that we are going to have a liaison to all our activities around town; Edison School, Home School, little league, football, the senior clubs, the Lions Club and the churches. He wants to put a calendar together so everyone knows who has what. It could be in a web site form, or the newsletter (which will be out on November 1). This plan is for 2018.

CLERK'S REPORT: The clerk provided information on a e-News Release from the governor. It is informing us of a public hearing for 55<sup>th</sup> Street improvement in Countryside. The IEPA notified us that Waste Management Metro is requesting to

continue to operate the outdoor landscape waste and food scrap transfer area for another 24 months.

TRUSTEE REPORTS: <u>Trustee Milenkovic</u> told us that we are going to start our Support our Troops collection. He read a lengthy list of the items most in need. The newsletter will have this list and there will be a list in the lobby along with collection containers. Last year Trustee Torres and the mayor delivered the products. In addition, the MWRD is having their tree program. They are giving away saplings.

<u>Trustee Torres</u>: added in that she wants to include both the schools in this collection. Last year only Edison participated. They will make up boxes for both locations. She will be working on revising the garage sale permit fees and inspection fees. She will be updating. The mayor added in that we are out-of-date with many of our ordinances. Trustee Torres originally came from the ordinance department.

<u>Trustee Hrejsa</u> announced the Halloween Bash on Saturday October 21, at Haley Park located at 40<sup>th</sup> and Grove. It is from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. There will be hay rides, spooky walk, pumpkin patch and refreshments. Parking is available at the clinic at 40<sup>th</sup> and Euclid. She asked for volunteers.

<u>Public Works Supervisor Joe Lopez:</u> He thanked the mayor for Family Day. It was a long day. Street sweeping will continue. Leaf removal will start in the beginning of October.

<u>Deputy Police Chief Rich Jaczak:</u> informed us that they did get a traffic unit going. The first four shifts 2:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. two to three hours each produced the following results:

Traffic Stops 35: State Tickets 13: Local Tickets 18: Verbal Warnings 2: Written Warnings 4: Towed Vehicles 1:

We also have our bicycle patrol going right now. One of our officers arrested someone with a suspended license while patrolling on the bicycle. Traffic is bad due to Harlem Avenue. Last Friday he was out around 2:00 p.m. He wrote four tickets in ½ hour. Halloween is coming up. We will send out a Code Red warning to residents to try to keep your kids in the area. The hayride is going to go for a four block radius. There will be plenty of officers out there.

<u>Fire Chief leff Boyajian</u>: explained that all of a sudden we are having an increase in accidents. We have had five in the last two days. There was an accident on 39<sup>th</sup> and Central. He went back by taking Harlem. It took him twenty to get from Harlem to 41<sup>st</sup>. The way people were making illegal turns and U-turns is amazing. Save the date December 2 on your calendar. We are going to have an open house at the fire house to celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Stickney Fire Department. They tried to get as close to the actual start date, which was December 1. It will be from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. More information will follow.

<u>Public Works Supervisor Joe Lopez:</u> October 19 we will start the leaf program. He gave specific rules about raking your leaves in the street or along the curb. He prefers the curb because it keeps the sewers open. Deputy Jaczak will send out a Code Red. One of our garbage trucks had a damaged cylinder. It took almost two weeks to refurbish it. Another garbage truck lost its air system. One of the trucks is a 2000 and the other 2005. Columbus Day is October 9. All pickups will be pushed back by a day. He loves Halloween and hopes that the Halloween Bash goes well.

<u>Treasurer Paul Nosek</u> mentioned that the financial statement audit was started. We started with a new firm this year. The old firm was with us eight to ten years. It will be nice having a new set of eyes on the books. They should be completed by the end of the month.

There being no further business, Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which the Board adopted the motion at 7:30 p.m.

## ORDINANCE NO. 2017-22

## AN ORDINANCE RESCINDING ORDINANCE NO. 2017-17 AND AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE PURCHASE OF A CERTAIN VEHICLE FOR THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

**WHEREAS,** the Village's Public Works Department (the "Department") serves the public by preserving Village property and public areas and providing needed services to residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, to ensure the continued efficient operation of the Department, the Department previously determined that it was in need of one (1) additional vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the Department previously provided a recommendation (the "Recommendation"), incorporated herein by reference, that the Village purchase one (1) 2017 Ford F-350-XL 4x2 Pickup Truck (the "2017 Vehicle"); and

WHEREAS, Currie Motors ("Currie"), provided the Village with a proposal for the purchase of the 2017 Vehicle, incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") previously considered and adopted Ordinance 2017-17, entitled, "An Ordinance Authorizing And Approving The Purchase Of A Certain Vehicle For The Village Of Stickney" ("Ordinance No. 2017-17"), which authorized the purchase of the 2017 Vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 Vehicle is no longer available; and

WHEREAS, Currie has provided the Village with a new proposal (the "Proposal"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, for a 2018 Ford F-350-XL 4x2 Pickup Truck (the "2018 Vehicle"); and

WHEREAS, in light of the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities deem it advisable and necessary for the operation of the Department and the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village to rescind Ordinance 2017-17 which authorized the purchase of the 2017 Vehicle and to authorize the purchase of the 2018 Vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable, and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to take all steps necessary to purchase the 2018 Vehicle in accordance with the terms of the Proposal and to waive any competitive bidding requirement associated therewith;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

**SECTION 1: RECITALS.** The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 2: PURPOSE.** The purpose of this Ordinance is to rescind Ordinance 2017-17, which authorized the purchase of the 2017 Vehicle, to authorize the purchase of the 2018 Vehicle in accordance with the terms of the Proposal, to waive any bidding requirement associated with the purchase of the 2018 Vehicle, and to authorize the President or his designee to take all necessary steps to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 3: AUTHORIZATION**. The Board hereby rescinds Ordinance 2017-17 and authorizes the purchase of the 2018 Vehicle in accordance with the terms of the Proposal; waives any bidding requirements related to the purchase of the 2018 Vehicle; authorizes and directs the President or his designee to execute any and all necessary documentation to effectuate the same, with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the President and the Village Attorney; and ratifies any additional actions taken to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance. The Board further authorizes the President or his designee to execute any and all additional documentation that may be necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign any documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance. The Village Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Village to such documentation as is deemed necessary. To the extent that any requirement of bidding would be applicable to the 2018 Vehicle described herein, the same is hereby waived.

**SECTION 4. HEADINGS.** The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.** The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

**SECTION 6. SUPERSEDER.** All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

**SECTION 7. PUBLICATION.** A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

**SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Ordinance shall be effective and in full force immediately upon passage and approval as provided by law.

### ORDINANCE NO. 2017- 23

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2017-03 AND AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE PURCHASE OF A CERTAIN VEHICLE FOR THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

**WHEREAS,** the Village's Police Department (the "Department") protects the public by responding to criminal activity and other emergencies; and

WHEREAS, to ensure the continued efficient operation of the Department, the Department previously determined that it was in need of two (2) additional vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the Department previously provided a recommendation (the "Recommendation"), incorporated herein by reference, that the Village purchase one (1) 2017 Chevrolet Tahoe Police Patrol Package Vehicle (the "2017 Tahoe") and one (1) 2017 Ford Police Interceptor Utility AWD (the "2017 Ford Police Interceptor"); and

WHEREAS, Currie Motors ("Currie"), provided the Village with proposals for the purchase of the Vehicles (together, the "Currie Proposals"), incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") previously authorized the purchase of the 2017 Tahoe and the 2017 Ford Police Interceptor pursuant to Ordinance No. 2017-03, entitled "An Ordinance Authorizing And Approving The Purchase Of Certain Vehicles For The Village Of Stickney" ("Ordinance No. 2017-03"); and

WHEREAS, the Village subsequently purchased the 2017 Ford Police Interceptor, but the 2017 Tahoe is no longer available from Currie; and

WHEREAS, Jack Phelan Chevrolet ("Phelan") has provided a proposal (the "Phelan Proposal"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, for the purchase of a 2018 Chevrolet Tahoe Police Patrol Package Vehicle (the "2018 Tahoe"); and

WHEREAS, in light of the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities deem it advisable and necessary for the operation of the Department and the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village to amend Ordinance 2017-03 by rescinding authority to purchase the 2017 Tahoe and to authorize the purchase of the 2018 Tahoe; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable, and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to take all steps necessary to purchase the 2018 Tahoe in accordance with the terms of the Phelan Proposal and to waive any competitive bidding requirement associated therewith;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

**SECTION 1: RECITALS.** The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 2: PURPOSE.** The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Ordinance 2017-03 by rescinding authority to purchase the 2017 Tahoe, to authorize the purchase of the 2018 Tahoe in accordance with the terms of the Phelan Proposal, to waive any bidding requirement associated with the purchase of the 2018 Tahoe, and to authorize the President or his designee to take all necessary steps to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3: AUTHORIZATION. The Board hereby amends Ordinance 2017-03 by rescinding authority for the purchase of the 2017 Tahoe and authorizes the purchase of the 2018 Tahoe in accordance with the terms of the Phelan Proposal; waives any bidding requirements related to the purchase of the 2018 Tahoe; authorizes and directs the President or his designee to execute any and all necessary documentation to effectuate the same, with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the President and the Village Attorney; and ratifies any additional actions taken to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance. The Board further authorizes the President or his designee to execute any and all additional documentation that may be necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign any documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance. The Village Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Village to such documentation as is deemed necessary. To the extent that any requirement of bidding would be applicable to the 2018 Tahoe described herein, the same is hereby waived.

SECTION 4. HEADINGS. The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for the

convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.** The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

**SECTION 6. SUPERSEDER.** All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

**SECTION 7. PUBLICATION.** A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

**SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Ordinance shall be effective and in full force immediately upon passage and approval as provided by law.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2017-24

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-120 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING STOP STREETS

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of Village residents; and

WHEREAS, currently, there are yield signs at the intersection of Grove Avenue and 42<sup>nd</sup> Street (the "Intersection"); and

WHEREAS, in order to provide for the safe movement of vehicular and pedestrian traffic, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to require vehicles to come to a complete stop at the Intersection; and

WHEREAS, it is understood that additional steps need to be taken to ensure that the traffic control signs are properly installed and maintained at the Intersection; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 14, Section 14-120 of the Municipal Code, Village Of Stickney, Illinois (the "Village Code") as set forth below;

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

#### ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

#### SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

#### SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 14, Section 14-120 of the Village Code to require vehicles to come to a complete stop at the Intersection and to authorize the President or his designee to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

#### ARTICLE II. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-120 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

### SECTION 3.0. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-120.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 14, Section 14-120 as follows:

#### Sec. 14-120. – Stop Streets.

(a) Except when directed to proceed by a police officer or traffic-control signal, every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop intersection indicated by a stop sign shall stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersections, or if none, then at the point nearest the intersecting roadway where the driver has a view of approaching traffic on the intersecting roadway before entering the intersection. After having stopped, the driver shall yield the right-of-way to any vehicle which has entered the intersection from another roadway or which is approaching so closely on the roadway as to constitute an immediate hazard during the time when the driver is moving across or within the intersection, but said driver having so yielded may proceed at such time as a safe interval occurs.

#### SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

#### SECTION 6. SUPERSEDER.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

#### SECTION 7. PUBLICATION.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.
