He is licensed, bonded and insured with the Village. He has his license number here. He has taken the RPZ test. He will be ready to go on November 1. He has been tagging along with Vito to understand what Vito does. We are sorry to see Vito go. He has been here forever. We are having a luncheon for him.

Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos to approve consideration and possible final action regarding the Stickney Wolfpack parade.

Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Mayor Walik explained that the parade already took place. They got their request to us late. We told them that next year they need to get their information to us sooner.

MAYOR'S REPORT: Mayor Walik reported that the police stairs are at a standstill. We are going to get the lot paved. There are a few street lights out in the Village. Notify us if you see one out, please report it. This is most unusual for LEDs.

TRUSTEE REPORTS: <u>Trustee Hrejsa</u> informed us that this Saturday is the Halloween Bash in Haley Park from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. Expect something spectacular. There will be cotton candy, popcorn, lemonade, a pumpkin patch and scary monsters. It is free.

<u>Trustee Milenkovic</u> mentioned that the trees for our tree lottery will be coming in on the 23rd of this month. Supervisor Lopez will see that they get planted.

<u>Trustee Savopoulos</u> told us that they are ready to kick off the 50/50 sidewalk replacement program. The contractor will be starting Wednesday or Thursday of this week. There are approximately 150 squares to be replaced.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS: <u>Public Works Supervisor Joe Lopez</u> informed us that the leaf program starts on Thursday.

Police Chief Dan Babich explained, "Chief William Kushner of the Des Plaines Police Department will be presenting the Illinois Chiefs of Police Citizens Award where he serves as Vice President. He had also been the Chief of Police for Lakemore, Berwyn and now the Chief of Des Plaines." "He is one of the best chiefs in the surrounding area. I have known him for many years." At this point, Chief Babich asked Tracyie Leach to step forward and read the following. "On August 7, 2016 Hawthorne Race Course was hosting its annual 'Belize Fest'. Despite extensive efforts by Hawthorne security, several individuals snuck weapons into what was traditionally a peaceful gathering. Altercations broke out and two separate shootings occurred within a short time frame. Hawthorne Security Agent Tracyie Leach saw one of the shootings occur. He tackled the shooter and wrestled a gun away from him. His act was nothing short of heroic and he undoubtedly saved many lives. The Village of Stickney and law enforcement community would like to thank Mr. Leach for his selfless deed." Mr. Leach said, "I don't want to say too much, I was just doing my job. We handled it." He thanked Chief Babich for nominating him.

There being no further business, Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which the Board adopted the motion at 7:20 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-_25

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 86, SECTION 86-151 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING BACKFLOW PREVENTION DEVICES

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of individuals residing in, working in and visiting the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities previously adopted the Illinois Plumbing Code (the "Plumbing Code") to regulate plumbing within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney, Illinois (the "Village Code") currently sets forth certain regulations for the installation and maintenance of backflow prevention devices (the "Existing Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities recognize the need to update and clarify the Existing Regulations to reflect compliance with the state Plumbing Code; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 86, Section 86-151 of the Village Code as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 86, Section 86-151 of the Village Code to update and clarify the Village's Existing Regulations, and to authorize the President or his designee to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 86, SECTION 86-151 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0 AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 86, SECTION 86-151.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 86, Section 86-151 as follows:

Sec. 86-151. - Compliance with state plumbing code required.

All plumbing installed within the village shall be installed in accordance with the Illinois Plumbing Code, 77 Ill. Adm. Code 890. If, in accordance with Section 890.1130(c) of the Illinois Plumbing Code or in the judgement of the superintendent of water, an approved backflow prevention device is necessary for the safety of the public water supply system, the Water Operator superintendent of water will give notice to the water customer to install such an approved device immediately. The water customer shall, at his own expense, install such an approved device at a location and in a manner in accordance with Section 890.1130(f) of the Illinois Plumbing Code, state environmental protection agency and all applicable local regulations, and shall have inspections and tests made of such approved devices upon installation and as required by Section 890.1130(b) of the Illinois Plumbing Code, state environmental protection agency and local regulations.

SECTION 3.1. OTHER ACTIONS AUTHORIZED.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4. HEADINGS.

The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. SUPERSEDER.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 7. PUBLICATION.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be effective and in full force ten (10) days after its passage, approval and publication in accordance with Illinois law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-26

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 18, SECTION 18-325 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS REGARDING FENCING

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of Village residents and increasing property values within the Village; and

WHEREAS, currently, fences on residential lots adjacent to commercial, business or industrial districts or adjacent to a "T" alley in a residential district, may be erected to a height of no more than six (6) feet (the "Existing Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, in order to reduce noise pollution and increase property values, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to clarify the Existing Regulations; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 18, Section 18-325 of the Municipal Code, Village Of Stickney, Illinois (the "Village Code") as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 18, Section 18-325 of the Village Code to clarify the Existing Regulations and to authorize the President or his designee to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II.

AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 18, SECTION 18-325 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 18, SECTION 18-325.

That the Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 18, Section 18-325 as follows:

Sec. 18-325. - Height.

- (a) In general. No fence shall be allowed or erected in the village which exceeds five feet in height, except as otherwise provided in this chapter. An additional one foot of decorative open trellis design may be erected atop a solid design fence to achieve a total height not to exceed five feet. All heights in this section shall include any decorative top.
- (b) Rear lot lines. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, fences along rear lot lines in all zoning districts may be erected to a height not to exceed six feet.
- (c) Residential lots adjacent to business, commercial or industrial districts. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, fences on residential lots adjacent to a business, commercial, business or industrial district, residential lots adjacent to Pershing Road or Harlem Avenue, and residential lots or adjacent to a "T" alley in a residence district, may be erected to a height not to exceed six feet.

SECTION 3.1. OTHER ACTIONS AUTHORIZED.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4. HEADINGS.
