The Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney met in regular session on Tuesday, November 15, 2022, at 7:03 p.m. in the Stickney Village Hall, 6533 W. Pershing Road, Stickney, Illinois.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees were present: Trustees Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Absent: Trustee White

Trustee Hrejsa moved, duly seconded by Trustee Torres to approve the minutes of the previous regular session on Tuesday, November 1, 2022.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustees Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres and Hrejsa Nays: None Absent: Trustee White Present: Trustee Kapolnek Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee Savopoulos moved, duly seconded by Trustee Milenkovic that the bills, approved by the various committees of the Board, be approved for payment, and to approve warrants which authorize the Village Treasurer to draw checks to pay the bills, to be signed by the authorized signers, as provided for by the Ordinances of the Village of Stickney.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustees Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Nays: None Absent: Trustee White Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee Torres moved, duly seconded by Trustee Hrejsa to approve the recommendation to request approval to initiate the process to contact the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners to hire (4) Probationary Police Officers off the current New Hire Eligibility List and Lateral Police Officers Eligibility List within the next few months for the Village of Stickney, County of Cook, State of Illinois

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustees Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Nays: None Absent: Trustee White Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Prior to the vote, Police Chief Sassetti informed us that over the course of the last few years we have been applying for a grant through the U.S. Department of Justice. We were recently notified that our application for fiscal year 2022, the Department of Justice approved what is called the COPS HIRING GRANTS and authorized an additional four police officers funded through the COPS GRANT. This recommendation is to fulfill our requirement with the grant.

Trustee Milenkovic moved, duly seconded by Trustee Hrejsa to Pass and Approve Ordinance 2022-21, "An Ordinance Amending Chapter 6, Article II, Section 6-45 of the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney, Illinois regarding Liquor Licenses"

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustees Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Nays: None Absent: Trustee White Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Prior to the vote the Mayor explained that this is adding two more liquor licenses, one for the racetrack and another will be open for right now.

Trustee Savopoulos moved, duly seconded by Trustee Torres to Pass and Approve Ordinance 2022-22, "An Ordinance Approving the purchase of a certain vehicle for the Village of Stickney Police Department, Stickney, Illinois"

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustees Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Nays: None Absent: Trustee White Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Prior to the vote the Mayor explained that this is adding just one car to the fleet. We actually need three. They are not making cars at this time. We were lucky we found this one. We purchased it quickly before it got away from us.

Trustee Kapolnek moved, duly seconded by Trustee Hrejsa to Pass and Approve Ordinance 2022-23, "An Ordinance Authorizing an Intergovernmental Agreement for Participation in the Mutual Aid and Box Alarm System (MABAS)"

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustees Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Nays: None Absent: Trustee White Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee Kapolnek moved, duly seconded by Trustee Hrejsa to pass Resolution 20-2022, "A Resolution Authorizing and Intergovernmental Agreement for Participation in the Mutual Air Box Alarm System (MABAS)."

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustees Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Nays: None Absent: Trustee White Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Page 3

Trustee Savopoulos moved, duly seconded by Trustee Milenkovic to approve Resolution 21-2022, "A Resolution Authorizing and Approving a Settlement with Commonwealth Edison Company and Azavar Audit Solutions, Inc. for the Village of Stickney"

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: Trustees Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Nays: None Absent: Trustee White Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Prior to the vote, Trustee Savopoulos informed us that this is reimbursement for a utility tax collected for us by Commonwealth Edison. Azavar sued on our behalf to collect the \$28,605. Now we are collecting the money that we never received from this utility tax. Every bill that you get, whether gas, electric or any utility bill, gets taxed. Commonwealth Edison wasn't collecting for us, so we were not receiving the tax.

<u>MAYOR'S REPORT</u>: The Mayor reminded people that the cold and flu season is here. Covid is still around. Please take precautions protecting yourself. Our Veteran's celebration was amazing. The money is starting to come through. The Mayor just displayed a parking sign that will reserve a Village parking spot on Village property for a Veteran. We will be installing six such signs. Everything is going good in the Village. Public Works did snow and leaves today.

<u>Trustee Savopoulos:</u> We were told that he had a conference with Josh Brniak, our Building Inspector. There is a new business in our Village. It should be opening up in a couple of weeks. It is next to Villa Nova. It will be a corned beef shop. The Mayor mentioned that this corner has really been beautified.

<u>Trustee Milenkovic</u>: We were reminded that the garbage schedule will be pushed back a day. The Operation Support our Troops drive is underway. Additional donations are still able to be made. The Trustee attended the Midway Noise Compatibility Commission on October 27, 2022. Next year's schedule was given. During the 3rd quarter of 2021 Midways average daily operations were 668. The average nighttime operations were 116. The most popular airplane is the Boeing 737, with 450 operations. Our noise monitor is located at 4308 Wenonah. During the 3rd quarter of 2022 the decibel level was 52.9. Our 12-month average was 51.8 decibels. There were no noise complaints from Stickney during the 3rd quarter of 2022.

<u>Trustee Torres:</u> The Trustee announced that all the newsletters went out. It is very informative and provides the residents with all the dates for everything going on. On December 17 there will be pet photos with Santa at the public works garage.

<u>Trustee Kapolnek:</u> He reminded everyone to access our website. There is information there that is valuable to residents. They can learn about what is going on. There are notice alerts. There are pictures of events. The newsletters can be found there. It is a useful tool. Make use of it.

<u>Trustee Hrejsa</u>: The Senior Christmas luncheon is on December 10th, 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The Children's Christmas party will be from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. it will be located at the Stickney Township Clinic, 6721 W. 40th Street.

<u>CLERK'S REPORT</u>: She directed people to go to her newsletter article concerning the engraving on the Veteran's memorial. She asked that people follow the instructions available when they submit their request.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

<u>Public Works Director Joe Lopez:</u> He mentioned that leaf collection will continue while the weather cooperates. He asked that people place their leaves at the curb.

Fire Chief Jeff Boyajian: There have been two or three calls per night.

Police Chief James Sassetti: Once again we were awarded the Illinois Department of Transportations fiscal year 2023 sustained traffic enforcement program grant. It will provide additional traffic safety missions. During the Thanksgiving week of November 18 and November 28, we will be putting additional manpower on the street with the sole purpose of monitoring motorists who are not wearing their seatbelts. We encourage everyone to Click it or Ticket. Furthermore, since the beginning of August, we have been awarded six different grants for a total sum of \$697, 820. 30. There are two additional grants in the que that total \$24,500. We received our monthly report from our Cicero Consolidated Dispatch, our dispatch center. Last month our calls for service were the highest year to date. Unfortunately, I am here to tell you that the calls for October we responded to 1,622 calls which surpassed our August totals. That is our highest year to date.

There being no further business, Trustee Savopoulos moved, duly seconded by Trustee Torres that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which the Board adopted the motion at 7:33 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-23

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE LEVY AND ASSESSMENT OF TAXES FOR THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") have determined and do hereby determine that the amounts of money specified herein, exclusive of any cost of conducting an election required by the general election law, are estimated to be necessary to be raised by taxation upon the taxable property in the Village; and

WHEREAS, in connection therewith, the Corporate Authorities previously adopted the annual appropriation ordinance for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2022, and ending April 30, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is advisable, necessary, and in the best interests of the Village to levy and assess taxes for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2022, and ending April 30, 2023; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the adoption of its tax levy, the Village has complied with Sections 18-60 through 18-85 of the Truth in Taxation Law (35 ILCS 200/18-60 through 35 ILCS 200/18-85), the Open Meetings Act (5 ILCS 120/1, *et seq.*) and all other applicable state and local laws;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to approve the levy and assessment of taxes for the Village for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2022 and ending April 30, 2023 and to authorize the President or his designee to take all steps necessary to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II. AUTHORIZATION

SECTION 3. AUTHORITY

This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, the Illinois Property Tax Code and the Village's home rule powers as set forth in the Constitution of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 4. OTHER ACTIONS AUTHORIZED

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the legislative action contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms to be utilized in connection with this Ordinance.

ARTICLE III. TAX LEVY

SECTION 5. TOTAL AMOUNT OF APPROPRIATIONS TO BE COLLECTED FROM THE TAX LEVY.

The total amount of appropriations for all corporate purposes legally made to be collected from the tax levy of the current fiscal year is hereby ascertained to be the sum of \$2,826,142.00.

SECTION 6. PURPOSES PROVIDED FOR.

The sum of \$2,826,142.00 being the total of appropriations heretofore legally made that are to be collected from the tax levy of the current fiscal year of the Village for all corporate purposes of the Village, for purposes of providing for a Policemen's Pension Fund and such other corporate purposes as permitted by statute as set forth on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein, as appropriated for the current fiscal year, be and the same is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property in the Village subject to taxation for the current year, the specific amounts as levied for the various funds heretofore named being included herein on Exhibit A by being placed in separate columns under the heading "Amount To Be Raised By Tax Levy," which appears over the same, the tax so levied being for the current fiscal year of the Village, and for said appropriation to be collected from said tax levy, the total of which has been ascertained as aforesaid and being as provided in Exhibit A, as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 7. AMOUNT LEVIED

The total amount of \$2,826,142.00 ascertained above, be and is hereby levied and assessed on all property subject to taxation within the Village according to the value of said property as assessed and equalized for state and county purposes for the current year.

SECTION 8. STATE AUTHORITY TO ADOPT ORDINANCE.

This levy Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the procedures set forth in the Illinois Municipal Code and the Illinois Property Tax Code, provided, however, any tax rate limitation or any other substantive limitations as to tax levies set forth in applicable law that are in conflict with this Ordinance shall not be applicable to this Ordinance pursuant to Article VII, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 9. CERTIFICATION OF LEVY.

There is hereby certified to the Cook County Clerk of Cook County, Illinois, the total amount \$2,826,142.00 which total amount the Village requires to be raised by taxation for the current fiscal year of the Village, and the Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to file with the Cook County Clerk, on or before the time required by law, which is the last Tuesday in December, a certified copy of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVING CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 10. HEADINGS.

The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 11. SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 12. SUPERSEDER.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 13. PUBLICATION.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 14. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be effective and in full force immediately upon its passage and approval.

This agreement will become effective on the date of execution of same and will remain in full force and effect for a period of six weeks which is agreed to be six weeks from the commencement of training, or unless earlier terminated as provided in Article IV of this agreement. Training shall commence no later than <u>March 20th</u>, 2023, and is estimated to conclude on or before <u>April 28th</u>, 2023.

ARTICLE II

The contractor will perform the services specified in the description of services attached to this agreement and incorporated herein by reference. The Contractor shall provide the pre-training of One(1) canine(s) supplied by the Contractor and the training of One(1) handler chosen by the Department. It is specifically agreed that the Contractor shall have sole and exclusive discretion to determine the methods, details and means of performing the services more fully described in Article IV.

ARTICLE III

In consideration for the services to be performed by the Contractor, the Department agrees to pay the Contractor the sum of \$16,000.00 said to be paid as follows: \$10,000.00 deposit to be paid by February 6th. 2023, and the balance of \$6.000.00 before the conclusion of the training session, no later than April 28th. 2023. If the Department desires to terminate the Agreement prior to the conclusion of the six-week training session, the Department shall forfeit all sums of money paid to the Contractor.

ARTICLE IV

The Contractor agrees to devote his time, expertise, and effort to the performance of his services to the Department as contracted to under the terms of the Agreement; however, it is specifically understood by the parties that the Contractor may at his discretion engage in and provide other services for additional clients, departments and individuals who may not be a party to this Agreement during the length of this Agreement.

The contractor will supply all the food and board for the canines who are participating in pre-training under the terms of this Agreement. Further, the Contractor will supply all tools and instruments required to perform the services as contracted to under the terms of the Agreement.

The Department assumes sole and complete responsibility and liability for all injuries that may be sustained by either the canines or handlers which may occur during the training sessions or after the conclusions of the training sessions.

It is specifically understood and agreed that the Contractor will not be providing worker's compensation insurance to the handlers who may be participating in the training sessions. It is specifically understood and agreed upon by the parties that the Department shall always maintain a liability insurance policy on behalf of their canines.

The Contractor will not be liable to the Department or any other individuals who may claim any right due to a relationship with the Department for any act or omission in the performance of the services contracted for under the terms of this Agreement.

Neither this Agreement nor any of the duties or obligations provided for under the terms of the same may be assigned by the Contractor without the prior written consent of the Department.

ARTICLE V

Contractor agrees to train the respective canines possessing the proper drives and characteristics, in the following areas: tracking, area search, article search, building search, criminal apprehension, obedience work, handler protection and narcotics detection with respect to cocaine, heroin, methamphetamines and all their derivatives. (NO) (YES)(NOT SURE YET) Marijuana. Provided that the canine team(s) meets the standards and requirements of the North American Police Work Dog Association at the conclusion of the training sessions contracted for under the terms of this Agreement, the Contractor agrees to certify said canine(s) and handler(s).

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this Agreement to be executed by their duly authorized officer, intending to be legally bound hereby.
