The Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney met in regular session on Tuesday, March 19, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. in the Stickney Village Hall, 6533 W. Pershing Road, Stickney, Illinois.

The clerk Audrey McAdams asked people to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees were present: Trustees DeLeshe, Gomez, Lazansky, Savopoulos, Sleigher and White

Clerk Audrey McAdams asked for a motion to appoint a temporary chairman pro tem.

Trustee Savopoulos moved, duly seconded by Trustee Gomez to appoint Trustee White as Chairman Pro Tem.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: De Leshe, Gomez, Lazansky, Savopoulos, Sleigher and White Nays: None

Trustee Sleigher moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos, to approve the minutes of the previous regular session on Tuesday, March 4, 2014.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: De Leshe, Gomez, Lazansky, Savopoulos, Sleigher and White Nays: None Chairman Pro Tem White declared the motion carried.

Trustee Lazansky moved, duly seconded by Trustee Gomez that the bills, approved by the various committees of the Board, be approved for payment, and to approve warrants which authorize the Village Treasurer to draw checks to pay the bills, to be signed by the authorized signers, as provided for by the Ordinances of the Village of Stickney.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: De Leshe, Gomez, Lazansky, Savopoulos, Sleigher and White Nays: None Chairman Pro Tem White declared the motion carried.

Trustee Lazansky moved, duly seconded by Trustee De Leshe to accept the report from the Illinois Department of Revenue for sales tax collected for the month of December, 2013 indicating the sum of \$37,070.05.

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Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: De Leshe, Gomez, Lazansky, Savopoulos, Sleigher and White Nays: None Chairman Pro Tem White declared the motion carried.

Trustee Lazansky moved, duly seconded by Trustee Sleigher to accept the report from the Illinois Department of Transportation for the month of February, 2014 in the amount of \$13,781.29.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: De Leshe, Gomez, Lazansky, Savopoulos, Sleigher and White Nays: None Chairman Pro Tem White declared the motion carried.

Trustee Sleigher moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos to approve the request from Misericordia to Conduct their Jelly Belly Candy Days fundraiser event on April 25 & 26, 2014.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: De Leshe, Gomez, Lazansky, Savopoulos, Sleigher and White Nays: None Chairman Pro Tem White declared the motion carried.

Prior to vote, the Chairman Pro Tem asked if they had all their appropriate insurance and hold harmless turned in. He was told by the clerk that all paperwork has been turned in. Trustee Sleigher asked if any other groups were going to be solicitating on the same day. He was told, "No".

CLERK'S REPORT: Information was provided about a notice from the Environmental Protection Agency of a request for a permit for the West Cook Transfer Station to add mobile wood grinding equipment to the existing construction and demolition waste recycling process. There is an open public meeting for the bid opening of the Children's Park Improvements on March 20, 2014 at 10:00 a.m. in the Court Room. A notice was referenced on the Shen Yun Performing Arts show at the Civic Opera House on April 2-5.

TRUSTEE REPORTS:

Trustee Lazansky moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos to accept the treasurer's report for the month of November, 2013.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees voted: Ayes: De Leshe, Gomez, Lazansky, Savopoulos, Sleigher and White Nays: None Chairman Pro Tem White declared the motion carried.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS: Deputy Police Chief Jaczak informed us that street sweeping will begin. Tickets will actually start being written on April 3. On the next two Thursdays and Fridays cars parked on the wrong sides of the street will receive a notice on their windshields. This will be written in English and Spanish. He

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continued to comment that hopefully the snow tickets are done. A total of 800 were written. The Annual Report is done. Instead of last year and this year, they also included a ten and twenty year as far as crime rates. Everything is down compared to what it was.

Fire Chief Larry Meyer reminded us that he submits a request to the State Fire Marshall every year for reimbursement of training expenses. Last year they received a little over \$10,000. He needed to file this year's request by the end of last month. He received an email from the State Fire Marshall that his request was rejected because he was missing three months of reports to the Federal Government. The Chief complied by following up by proving the receipts for each report. We learned that our 2001 server wasn't backing up every night. A full description of the need for computer upgrades was then given. The data for the reimbursement was resubmitted.

Treasurer Kurt Kasnicka confirmed that the bid opening was advertised in the newspaper last week. Details were given on how the information on the bids is networked. He personally received several calls about the bid opening. He reminded us that this is funded in part by a grant.

Trustee Sleigher opened discussion on the mandatory 64-gallon recycling and yard waste containers. He felt that at least the recycling containers should be mandatory. The small blue containers are not able to contain the contents from blowing around. He recommended that we use the brown and yellow 64-gallon containers. Trustee Lazansky asked Public Works Supervisor Boyajian if it would make it easier for the workers. He replied that it slows the workers down because they have to attach the container to the mechanism. Although it is a good idea. Trustee Savopoulos said, "If you make it mandatory, what about people who can't afford it?" Trustee Sleigher said he would buy them one. Treasurer Kasnicka said the cost is approximately \$50 and ask the residents to pay \$25 of that cost. An audience member said that she heard that Waste Management was going to take us over. Supervisor Boyajian has not heard that. Trustee White remarked that if people can't afford it they probably would stop recycling. Trustee Sleigher felt they would put it in the big garbage containers. Another audience member felt that many people really need two garbage containers. An audience member testified that he has picked up the blue recycling containers that have blown in the streets. Supervisor Boyajian informed us that they have stopped buying the small blue containers. Therefore, people will have to buy the 64gallon recycling containers because there is nothing else available. The clerk asked about structuring the payment schedule. Trustee White felt that the adjudication hearings have many people who can't pay their water bills, let alone have an attachment on it for one of these containers. Trustee Lazansky reminded us that in 1980 we paid for the alleys in such a payment structure. It was once a year for 10 years. Trustee De Leshe commented that anyone that comes in now has to buy one. He continued to say that we just shot down two tax increases and these garbage cans are more than the tax increases. Trustee White reminded us that we are also shouldering the water increase that took effect at the beginning of this year. Trustee De Leshe suggested that notices be given to those residents who have broken or cracked blue bins. They will be told that they have to get one of the new ones. Supervisor Boyajian responded to the comment about overflowing garbage

containers. He suggested that the police department hire someone part time to enforce such a situation. Trustee De Leshe felt that we are not going to hire more people to do this. We should get the people we are paying to do their jobs. Another audience member asked why the public works employees couldn't use their radios to report overflowing garbage cans. The supervisor felt that if we did that, they would have to do it for almost every house. The ordinance officer wouldn't have time to do anything else. Trustee Savolopous felt that if we enforce that it would happen less and less. Trustee DeLeshe suggested we educate the people. Trustee White is preparing a booklet that can be given out to residents who don't know what our ordinances are. Trustee Sleigher reminded people that we don't ask people to buy stickers for their lawn waste. If we start a stickers program it would cost more than \$25. Trustee De Leshe commented on the dumping he has seen on Ridgeland Avenue along the fence line. He foresees that businesses will start seeing their garbage cans fill up. The dumping will triple wherever they can. He suggested that we look into something else. He also suggested if people have a destroyed blue bin, they should be notified they have to get a new one. If they refuse, then site them and get them a new one. An audience member asked if there is a limit as to how many of the garbage can a person can have. Supervisor Boyajian said that the second one can be purchased. Another audience member asked if there is a cost to have the second one emptied. Trustee De Leshe commented that the apartments on Harlem Avenue dump their garbage into the garbage cans belonging to the Maple Avenue homes because their dumpsters are overflowing.

There being no further business, Trustee Lazansky moved, duly seconded by Trustee Gomez that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which the Board adopted the motion at 7:26 p.m.

RE: Children's Park

On Thursday, March 20th, public bids were opened at 10:00 am. for the construction of Children's Park. After analyzing the bids and Alternates, we are recommending the Base Bid only at this time for the total project cost of \$ 198,608.38 to Fuerte Systems, Inc. of Plainfield. LandTech has had good experience with Fuerte in the past, and we believe them capable of performing in a quality fashion on the contract.

This will put the project at approximately \$ 20,000.00 over the project budget. We attribute this to the disastrous spring start of this construction season, and some costs that went up since the final design.

We have analyzed the bids with Fuerte, and identified 3 items where we know costs can be reduced.

- 1. The ornamental fencing was specified at too high of a performance level, and can be safely reduced in specification savings of \$ 5000.00.
- 2. Fuerte is willing to discuss color changes and sub-contractor changes on the rubber surface we believe we can reduce this cost by \$ 10,000.
- 3. If needed, the design of the shelter can be reduced in its ornateness, and also save approximately \$ 10,000.
- 4. It is important to point out that any amount over the OSLAD project budget will not be matched by OSLAD.

Please call me if you have any questions or concerns. Upon approval by the Board, LandTech will begin to process contracts, value engineer the project with your approval, and get the project underway on your behalf.

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ORDINANCE NO. 2014-2

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 58 "PEDDLERS AND SOLICITORS" OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS BY REVISING SECTIONS 58-1 AND 58-2

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Section 58-1 entitled "Registration" of Chapter 58, "Peddlers and Solicitors" of the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney, Illinois is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 58-1. Registration.

It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in business as a canvasser or solicitor, calling at residences for the purpose of soliciting orders, sales, subscriptions, or business of any kind, or seeking information or donations without first having registered in the office of the village clerk. The registrant shall give the following submissions and information:

(1) The name, address, and telephone number of the applicant and length of time at such address; also, the business address and business telephone number of the applicant;

(2) The name, address and telephone number of the person, firm, corporation or association by whom the applicant is employed, or whom the applicant represents;

(3) The names and addresses of the people organizing and supervising the solicitation;

(4) The purpose(s) for which any solicited funds will be used;

(5) The method to be used in conducting the solicitation;

(6) The date and time when the solicitation is to take place;

(7) Whether a permit previously issued to this applicant or organization under this Chapter has ever been revoked;

(8) Whether the applicant, organization, or organization's members who will be soliciting have ever been convicted of a violation of any provision of this Chapter or any of the Village's ordinances, or any solicitor's ordinance of any municipality;

(9) Whether the applicant, organization, or organization's members who will be soliciting have ever been convicted of a felony under the laws of any state, and if so, the date of each such conviction, the nature of each offense, and the penalty assessed;

(10) Security in the amount of \$1,000 in the form of a surety bond in substance as described in Section 2-3 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Stickney as from time to time amended or replaced, or a cash deposit to ensure that the applicant and the employer of the applicant, if any, shall comply fully with all applicable ordinances of the Village and statutes of the state. Such security will be restored within thirty (30) days after the expiration of the Certificate of registration issued pursuant to the provision of this Chapter 58 provided that no charges have been brought against the applicant or employer of the applicant. If charges are brought, the security shall be held pending the outcome thereof and may be used, applied or retained by the Village to pay any fine and/or costs which may result from any such charges.

Each person that will solicit or canvass within the Village shall complete a separate application, and each registrant shall pay to the village clerk a registration fee of \$250.00, which shall apply for any applications by the registrant during a period of one year. The security submission described in subparagraph (10) above and the registration fee shall be waived for any person soliciting on behalf of an entity registered with the State of Illinois as a Charitable Organization under 225 ILCS 460/2, provided that the applicant provide the Village Clerk with evidence of such registration, and proper documentation showing the applicant's affiliation with such entity.

Any registration may be revoked by the president or the chief of police because of any violation by the registrant of this Chapter or of any other ordinance of the Village, or of any state or federal law.

Section 2. Section 58-2 entitled "Certificate" of Chapter 58, "Peddlers and Solicitors" of the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney, Illinois is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 58-2. Certificate.

The Village Clerk shall issue a certificate of registration to each applicant if the Clerk has reason to believe that:

- (1) The statements in the application are true;
- (2) Neither the applicant nor the organization has engaged in any fraudulent practices:
- (3) Neither the applicant nor the organization have been convicted of a violation of any provision of this Chapter or the solicitation ordinance of any other Illinois municipality in the past five (5) years:
- (4) Neither the applicant nor the organization and its members who will be soliciting have been convicted of a felony within the past five (5) years;
- (5) The bond required pursuant to the provisions of Section 58-1 of this Chapter has been submitted to the Village.

Each person shall at all times while soliciting or canvassing in the village carry upon his person the registration certificate, and the certificate shall be exhibited by such registrant whenever he is required to do so by any police officer or by any person solicited. Section 3. This Ordinance supersedes all ordinances or parts of ordinances directly conflicting with the terms and provisions contained herein, but only to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. This ordinance is enacted under the Home Rule powers of the Village as set forth in the Constitution and laws of the State of Illinois.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

ADMINISTRATION

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Sec. 2-1. Seal.

The village seal shall be the seal heretofore established by ordinance. (Code 1981, § 2-1)

State law reference—Authority to have a seal, 65 ILCS 5/2-3-8.

Sec. 2-2. Datum plane.

(a) The base or datum for the grades and levels of the village shall be a horizontal plane 28.36 feet below a square cut in the stone step of the west side of the front entrance to the village hall, which horizontal plane is a plane 579.896 feet above mean sea level. The above mean sea level is the established zero elevation by the United States Geological Survey.

(b) This section shall not be construed to confer any power on any person to fill streets or raise or lower them without having first obtained permission so to do from the president and board of trustees. The true intent and meaning of this section is to establish the grade for streets or portions of streets, but not order any of them filled or lowered. (Code 1981, § 2-2)

Sec. 2-3. Surety bonds.

(a) Whenever a surety bond to indemnify the village is required as a prerequisite to exercising the duties of any office or position, or to the issuance of a license or permit or for the exercise of any special privilege, the surety on such bond shall be a corporation licensed and authorized to do business in this state as a surety company, in the absence of specific provisions to the contrary by ordinance.

(b) Whenever, in its opinion, additional sureties are needed on any bond to indemnify the village against loss or liability because of the insolvency of the existing sureties or for any other reason, the board of trustees may order new sureties to be secured for such bond. If such new sureties are not procured within ten days from the time such order is transmitted to the principal of the bond, or his assignee, the board of trustees shall declare the bond to be void, and thereupon such principal or assignee shall be deemed to have surrendered the privilege or position as condition of which the bond was required. (Code 1981, § 2-3)

Sec. 2-4. Village jail.

The place in the village heretofore established and used as the jail, or any other place which may be hereafter used for that purpose, is hereby declared to be the village jail. The chief of police shall be the keeper of the jail and shall have custody over all persons confined therein and of all property pertaining thereto. The jail shall be used for the incarceration of all persons arrested for violating any law of the state, the United States, or for violating any village
