Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Prior to the vote Trustee White explained that we are going with the Green Energy. We did our research and found that the Brown Energy charges \$4.95 per month that we are paying with Eligo now, even though ComEd fluctuates a little bit a couple of times a year, it would be a "push". So by mirroring the rates with ComEd we will be a Green Energy community. We are also going to get a \$5,000.00 grant that we will match with our budget next year to put cameras in to Edison and Home Schools. Unfortunately we were very lucky with the last two contracts but rates have gone way up. If you are not happy with what the village goes with, you are able to opt out and go your own direction. This has a few positives because people will not be ringing your doorbell or calling you on the phone trying to switch your energy once we are in this contract.

Trustee Kapolnek moved, duly seconded by Trustee Hrejsa to Approve Resolution 21-2018, "A Resolution Agreeing to Indemnify the State of Illinois for Photo Enforcement Equipment Attached to IDOT Facilities, for the Village of Stickney, County of Cook, State of Illinois"

Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

The Mayor explained that the red light cameras will be located at Harlem and Pershing, Central and Pershing and Cicero and Pershing.

MAYOR'S REPORT: The Mayor thanked Trustee White, Public Works and the electric company for installing our new electronic sign. We are going to put our events on there. You can put on pictures. In addition, the Mayor thanked Eric Harris from Public Works for being here this evening. He brought over the new Kubota and truck. The small brush on the Kubota has been used on the sidewalks to clean the snow. The Mayor then told the audience that Eric is the person who has been painting the fire hydrants throughout the village pink, one that is red, white and blue and others are painted like Dalmatians. Great job! Joe Lopez, Public Works Director acknowledged that he would like to clone Eric. He is one great employee and a resident. Next, the Mayor showed the audience a blue bag that will be delivered to each home at the end of the week. It contains various trinkets, the latest newsletter and a handbook that provides information on village rules, services, village hall hours, a list of village businesses, and contact information. It had last been issued during Mayor Tabor's administration.

CLERK'S REPORT: A letter of gratitude was written to Mayor Walik and Board of Trustees from Deputy Chief John Babinec for recognizing his forty years of service with the Stickney Fire Department. In addition, she provided information about the availability of an application to receive a mail-in ballot to the Gubernatorial General Election on November 6. Lastly, the Illinois EPA notified the village of a permit to manage waste at a nearby facility.

TRUSTEE REPORTS: Trustee Hrejsa provided Music in the Park information.

Trustee Kapolnek supplied the audience with information about the document destruction event to be held on August 25.

Trustee Milenkovic informed us that the Tree Board met last week. We learned that seven residents will receive a tree from the tree lottery. Two trees will be planted in Veteran's Memorial Park and one tree at a vacant house at 4400 Wenonah. The trees this year are Eastern Red Bud, Autumn Blaze, Red Oak and White Oak. The trees will be order mid-September and planted in early October.

Trustee Savopoulos notified us that the sidewalk replacements will be starting in October.

Trustee White told us that it is a learning curve to type in the messages on the new electronic sign. If there is any community event he is able to promote it on the sign. He also told us about a new scam that he learned about. A resident came in with a letter she received in the mail with a ComEd logo. The letter said that her supplier was going to be changed to a different supplier that wasn't Eligo. Had she called the number listed in the context of the letter, she would be switching her carrier to someone she didn't know anything about. It was a solicitation letter. This is the time that all these suppliers know that our contract will be expiring at the end of September. Trustee White assured people that there will be no salutation from ComEd or Eligo. People have the option if they want to switch to someone else.

The representative, Dennis Brennan from Electric Aggregation LLC., was in the audience. He mentioned that any of those letters that people get can be forwarded to himself or Trustee White.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

Public Works Director Joe Lopez thanked the board for purchasing the two new pieces of equipment that is on display in front of the village hall. We learned that there are 265 fire hydrants in the village.

Police Chief Dan Babich reminded people that the children will be returning to school on August 29. The police department will start doing traffic enforcement. Parents very often will pull into the bus zone to pick up or drop off. They end up getting stuck. He will be out there himself. Be cautious out there for the kids running across streets.

Police Sergeant McGuire remarked that he appreciates the new stop sign on 41st and Wesley. Hopefully it will slow down traffic.

Trustee Milenkovic moved, duly seconded by Trustee White to adjourn into Executive Session at 7:30 p.m.

WHEREAS, under the Village's Zoning Ordinance of 1980, as amended (the "Zoning Ordinance"), the Zoning Relief sought requires that a variance from the setback requirements be granted by the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board") after a hearing and recommendation by the Village's Zoning Board of Appeals (the "ZBA"); and

WHEREAS, the Applicant therefore submitted a request to the Village for the Zoning Relief; and

WHEREAS, the ZBA held a public hearing (the "Hearing"), pursuant to proper notice, on the Applicant's request for the Zoning Relief; and

WHEREAS, based on the testimony given at the Hearing, the ZBA made certain findings of fact and conclusions with respect to the requested Zoning Relief and a recommendation to the Village Board that the Zoning Relief be granted (collectively, the "Findings and Recommendation"); and

WHEREAS, a copy of the Findings and Recommendation is attached hereto as Exhibit A and is incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has determined that granting the Zoning Relief is in the best interests of the Village and is in furtherance of the public health, safety, and welfare;

WHEREAS, the Village Board has further determined that: (1) the particular physical surroundings, shape or topographical condition of the Property involved would result in a particular hardship upon the owner, as distinguished from a mere inconvenience, if the strict letter of the regulations were carried out; (2) the conditions upon which the petition for variation is based are unique to the Property for which the variation is sought; (3) the variation will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to other property or improvements in the neighborhood of the Property for which the variation is sought; and (4) that the Zoning Relief will not alter the essential character of the area nor negatively impact neighboring property values.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney, County of Cook, State of Illinois, in the exercise of its home rule powers as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are herein incorporated and made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. Grant of Setback Variance; Conditions. The Village Board concurs with and adopts the Findings and Recommendation and, in accordance with the findings and conclusions stated therein, hereby grants the requested Zoning Relief, subject to the conditions contained in the Findings and Recommendation. The term of the Zoning Relief shall be until the Applicant makes any changes or structural alterations to the Property unless such changes or structural alterations, and the use thereof, conform to all the regulations of the Single Family zoning district.

Section 3. Savings Clause. This Ordinance shall not affect suits pending or rights existing at the time this Ordinance takes effect. Such suits and rights shall continue in full force to the same extent and with like effect as if this Ordinance be taken, construed, or held to avoid or impair any cause of action now existing under any ordinance of the Village, or any amendment thereto, but as to any consideration of action now existing, such ordinance and amendment thereto, shall be continued in full force and effect.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication as provided by law.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND RECOMMENDATION

RE: 6944 40th Street, Stickney, Illinois (the “Subject Property”)

GRANT OF SETBACK VARIANCE

On August 21, 2018, the Zoning Board of Appeals (the “ZBA”) of the Village of Stickney (the “Village”) recommended granting a setback variance based on the following:

1. Gerardo Gutierrez (the “Applicant”) seeks a variation from the setback requirements of the Village’s Zoning Ordinance to allow a legal non-conforming building, which is non-conforming due to not being in compliance with the setback requirements of the Village of Stickney Zoning ordinance, to be altered and remodeled, which is located in the Single-Family Residential zoning district; and
2. Pursuant to the provisions of the Village’s Zoning Ordinance, as amended (the “Zoning Ordinance”), each lot shall have the following setback requirements (the “Setback Requirements”): (a) front yards – sixteen feet (16’); (b) rear yard – thirty feet (30’); and (c) side yard – three feet (3’); and
3. As it currently sits, the Subject Property does not comply with the Setback Requirements and per the Zoning Ordinance, any changes to a non-conforming use must comply with the requirement of the zoning district in which it sits. The Zoning Ordinance further allows for the Zoning Board of Appeals to recommend variations from the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance provided a hearing is held; and
4. Accordingly, the Applicant submitted a request to the Village seeking a variance from the Setback Requirements of the Zoning Ordinance to allow for a variance from the front yard setback requirement of sixteen feet (16’) to a zero-foot (0’) setback (the “Zoning Relief”) at the Subject Property; and
5. In accordance with the Illinois Compiled Statutes and the Zoning Ordinance, notice of the public hearing before the ZBA regarding the Zoning Relief (the “Hearing”) was published in one or more newspapers published in the Village; and
6. At the Hearing, the Applicant provided credible evidence establishing that: (a) the Applicant will be remodeling the Subject Property to add a dormer to the top floor to create more livable space; (b) the Applicant intends to live at the Subject Property once construction is completed and will use the Subject Property as a

single family residence, in compliance with the Zoning Ordinance; and (c) the Applicant will not be altering the footprint of the Subject Property where the non-conforming setback exists; and

7. In light of the above, the ZBA found that: (1) the particular physical surroundings, shape or topographical condition of the Subject Property involved would result in a particular hardship upon the owner, as distinguished from a mere inconvenience, if the strict letter of the regulations were carried out; (2) the conditions upon which the petition for variation is based are unique to the Subject Property for which the variation is sought; and (3) the variation will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to other property or improvements in the neighborhood of the Subject Property for which the variation is sought. Furthermore, the ZBA found that the Zoning Relief will not alter the essential character of the area nor negatively impact neighboring property values.

CONCLUSION

The Applicant provided evidence that the requested Zoning Relief would comply with the requirements set forth in the Zoning Ordinance. Based on the foregoing and the findings made herein, the ZBA recommends granting the Zoning Relief.

**AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A LOT SETBACK VARIANCE FOR THE PROPERTY
COMMONLY KNOWN AS 6900 43RD STREET, STICKNEY, ILLINOIS**

GRANT OF SETBACK VARIANCE

On August 21, 2018, the Zoning Board of Appeals (the “ZBA”) of the Village of Stickney (the “Village”) recommended granting a setback variance based on the following:

1. Corneliu Moldoveanu (the “Applicant”) seeks a variation from the setback requirements of the Village’s Zoning Ordinance to allow a legal non-conforming building, which is non-conforming due to not being in compliance with the setback requirements of the Village of Stickney Zoning ordinance, to be altered and remodeled, which is located in the Single-Family Residential zoning district; and
2. Pursuant to the provisions of the Village’s Zoning Ordinance, as amended (the “Zoning Ordinance”), each lot shall have the following setback requirements (the “Setback Requirements”): (a) front yards – sixteen feet (16’); (b) rear yard – thirty feet (30’); and (c) side yard – three feet (3’); and
3. As it currently sits, the Subject Property does not comply with the Setback Requirements and per the Zoning Ordinance, any changes to a non-conforming use must comply with the requirement of the zoning district in which it sits. The Zoning Ordinance further allows for the Zoning Board of Appeals to recommend variations from the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance provided a hearing is held; and
4. Accordingly, the Applicant submitted a request to the Village seeking a variance from the Setback Requirements of the Zoning Ordinance to allow for a variance from the rear yard setback requirement to allow a zero-foot (0’) setback and from the side yard setback requirement to allow for a one-foot (1’) setback (the “Zoning Relief”) at the Subject Property; and
5. In accordance with the Illinois Compiled Statutes and the Zoning Ordinance, notice of the public hearing before the ZBA regarding the Zoning Relief (the “Hearing”) was published in one or more newspapers published in the Village; and
6. At the Hearing, the Applicant provided credible evidence establishing that: (a) the Applicant will be remodeling the Subject Property to add an additional story to the portion of the Subject Property that currently is one-story; (b) the Applicant

will live at or rent or sell the Subject Property once construction is completed and will use, rent, or sell the Subject Property as a single family residence, in compliance with the Zoning Ordinance; and (c) the Applicant will be altering the footprint of the Subject Property however, said alteration will not be in the area of the Subject Property where the non-conforming setback exists and instead will be adding an additional foot or foot and a half to the existing structure where the structure currently does and will continue to comply with the setback requirements of the Zoning Ordinance;

7. In light of the above, the ZBA found that: (1) the particular physical surroundings, shape or topographical condition of the Subject Property involved would result in a particular hardship upon the owner, as distinguished from a mere inconvenience, if the strict letter of the regulations were carried out; (2) the conditions upon which the petition for variation is based are unique to the Subject Property for which the variation is sought; and (3) the variation will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to other property or improvements in the neighborhood of the Subject Property for which the variation is sought. Furthermore, the ZBA found that the Zoning Relief will not alter the essential character of the area nor negatively impact neighboring property values.

CONCLUSION

The Applicant provided evidence that the requested Zoning Relief would comply with the requirements set forth in the Zoning Ordinance. Based on the foregoing and the findings made herein, the ZBA recommends granting the Zoning Relief.

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-41

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE DISPOSAL OF OBSOLETE PERSONAL PROPERTY FOR THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 11-76-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-76-4), whenever a municipality owns any personal property which, in the opinion of a simple majority of the corporate authorities then holding office, is no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interests of the municipality, such a majority of the corporate authorities then holding office may: (1) authorize, by ordinance, the sale of that personal property in such manner as they may designate, with or without advertising the sale; (2) authorize any municipal officer to convert that personal property into some other form that is useful to the municipality by using the material in the personal property; or (3) authorize any municipal officer to convey or turn in any specified article of personal property as partial payment on a new purchase of any similar article; and

WHEREAS, the Village, as a home rule municipality, also has the authority to dispose of or discard obsolete personal property; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to sell, discard or otherwise dispose of certain obsolete personal property that no longer has value to the Village (the "Personal Property"), which is described in a certain document (the "Document"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Village intends to sell, discard or otherwise dispose of the Personal Property in a fair and reasonable manner; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") have reviewed the Document and have determined that retaining the Personal Property, which is obsolete, is no longer usable or repairable, or is surplus property or rubbish, is no longer necessary or useful to or in the best interests of the Village; and

WHEREAS, to ensure that the Village operates in an efficient and economical manner, it is necessary for the Village and Village employees to have adequate space, functional equipment and personal property; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities find that it is necessary for conducting Village business, the effective administration of government, and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to authorize designated Village staff to sell, discard, or otherwise dispose of the Personal Property;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS, as follows:

**ARTICLE I.
IN GENERAL**

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION CLAUSE.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to authorize designated Village staff to sell, discard or otherwise dispose of the Personal Property to help ensure that the Village and Village employees have adequate space, functional equipment and personal property, and to take all necessary steps to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

**ARTICLE II.
AUTHORIZATION**

SECTION 3. AUTHORIZATION.

The Village Board hereby authorizes and directs designated Village staff to sell, discard or otherwise dispose of the Personal Property in accordance with the terms of this Ordinance and ratifies any and all previous action taken to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance. The Village Board authorizes and directs the President and designated Village staff, or designees of the same, to execute any and all documentation that may be necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign any documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance. The Village Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Village to such documentation as is deemed necessary.

**ARTICLE III.
HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION,
EFFECTIVE DATE**

SECTION 4. HEADINGS.

The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or

regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. SUPERSEDER.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 7. PUBLICATION.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be effective and in full force immediately upon passage and approval.

RESOLUTION NO. 23-2018

**A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF, AND AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION FOR,
THE ENERGY EFFICIENCY PROGRAM FROM COMED FOR THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY,
COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.**

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, Commonwealth Edison ("ComEd") administers the Energy Efficiency Program (the "Program"), which grants rebates to communities based on the reduction of energy consumed for lighting and other electrical power uses (the "Grant"); and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities"), being committed to reducing the Village's energy usage and energy related costs, previously applied for and was awarded the Grant; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with the Grant, the Village desires to engage the services of a contractor to replace the existing street light luminaires with new LED street light luminaires to achieve these goals (the "Services"); and

WHEREAS, after competitive bidding, the Village Engineer determined that H & H Electric Co. ("H & H") was the lowest bidder and recommended that the contract be awarded to H & H; and

WHEREAS, H & H has provided a Local Public Agency Formal Contract, a form contract provided by the Illinois Department of Transportation, (the "Contract"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, which sets forth the terms, covenants and conditions under which H & H will provide the Services to the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to enter into and approve contracts with substantially the same terms as the terms of the Contract; and







Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, Masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean-up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

COMMUNICATIONS ELECTRICIAN

Installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair and service of radio, television, recording, voice sound vision production and reproduction, telephone and telephone interconnect, facsimile, data apparatus, coaxial, fiber optic and

wireless equipment, appliances and systems used for the transmission and reception of signals of any nature, business, domestic, commercial, education, entertainment, and residential purposes, including but not limited to, communication and telephone, electronic and sound equipment, fiber optic and data communication systems, and the performance of any task directly related to such installation or service whether at new or existing sites, such tasks to include the placing of wire and cable and electrical power conduit or other raceway work within the equipment room and pulling wire and/or cable through conduit and the installation of any incidental conduit, such that the employees covered hereby can complete any job in full.

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

MATERIAL TESTER & MATERIAL TESTER/INSPECTOR I AND II

Notwithstanding the difference in the classification title, the classification entitled "Material Tester I" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector I". Likewise, the classification entitled "Material Tester II" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector II".
