The Board of Trustees of the Village of Stickney met in regular session on Tuesday, August 15, 2023, at 7:07 p.m. in the boardroom located at 6533 W. Pershing Road, Stickney, Illinois.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustees were present: Trustees White, Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hreisa

Trustee Milenkovic moved, duly seconded by Trustee Hrejsa to approve the minutes of the regular board meeting held on Tuesday, August 1, 2023

Upon the roll call, the following Trustee voted: Ayes: Trustees White, Milenkovic, Torres and Hrejsa Present: Trustee Savopoulos, Kapolnek Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos that the bills, approved by the various committees of the Board, be approved for payment, and to approve warrants which authorize the Village Treasurer to draw checks to pay the bills, to be signed by the authorized signers, as provided for by the Ordinances of the Village of Stickney.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustee voted:

Ayes: Trustees White, Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee Torres moved, duly seconded by Trustee Kapolnek to Pass and Approve Ordinance Amending Chapter 14, Section 14-109 of the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney, Illinois Regarding Right Turn Regulations."

Upon the roll call, the following Trustee voted:

Ayes: Trustees White, Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Prior to the vote Chief Sassetti explained that we are seeking changes for vehicles going northbound on Harlem Avenue cannot make right turns on to 41st Street and 40th Place between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. The purpose of it is we have seen a lot of non-residents using 41st and 40th Place as through streets to avoid the Harlem Avenue traffic. I hope through the enforcement efforts after this ordinance is passed we can minimize the amount of cars that are using the interior streets as through streets.

Prior to the vote, Village Trustee Milenkovic questioned if Section (a) should be included in the time restrictions. Village Attorney Fese read the section and explained that an oral amendment could be made to include 44^{th} , 43^{rd} and 42^{nd} streets. Police Chief Sassetti clarified that these streets had barriers placed there back in late fall of 2020 after the civil unrest, at that time he asked the Board to leave the barricades up on 44^{th} , 43^{rd} and 42^{nd} Streets to prevent traffic from going eastbound. We plan on leaving those barricades up permanently.

Trustee Kapolnek moved, duly seconded by Trustee Torres to Pass and Approve Ordinance 2023-17, "An Ordinance Amending Chapter 18, Section 18-325 of the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney, Illinois Regarding Fencing."

Upon the roll call, the following Trustee voted:

Ayes: Trustees White, Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Prior to voting, a resident asked for an explanation of the ordinance. It was clarified that corner lots, including the last house on the alley, can have a six-foot fence and also the gate. Our Building Inspector Josh Brniak requested this because it is difficult to cut the fences down to five-foot heights.

Trustee Hrejsa moved, Trustee Kapolnek to grant permission to conduct a block party in the 4100 block of Wisconsin, August 26, 2023 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustee voted:

Ayes: Trustees White, Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee Torres moved, Trustee Kapolnek to grant permission to conduct a block party in the 4300 block of Maple, September 16, 2023 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustee voted:

Ayes: Trustees White, Savopoulos, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

MAYOR'S REPORT: Public Works is getting everything ready for the kids going back to school.. They are getting the trees trimmed and painting the markings on the street. We just came from Home School where Detective Ortiz cooked hot dogs for the kids at a back-to-school event. We have Family Day coming up. We are still looking for volunteers for the food.

<u>CLERK'S REPORT:</u> The clerk provided information concerning that the Stickney Township Assessor's office is open for tax appeals. Days and hours were given for their office. She also gave information on the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning provided a sizable amount of information in their Community Data Snapshot series 2023. It provides information obviously taken from the Census.

TRUSTEE REPORTS:

<u>Trustee White:</u> He reminded us that during the week of Labor Day, September 4, the garage pick up will be delayed. Our next meeting will be September 5th. On August 25, at 10:00 a.m. we will have a bid opening concerning the paving of 41st and 40th Street and part of East Avenue. Hopefully we will be able to accept one of those bids. The Mayor interjected that these are paid for through a grant from Cook County. It is no cost to the taxpayers.

Trustee Savopoulos: A tentative Zoning Board meeting was discussed.

Trustee Milenkovic: There was a Tree Board meeting on August 9th at 3:30. We are ordering twelve trees for our lottery. We received only four requests from residents this year. During the most recent storm three trees at Home School were damaged. We will replace them in different spots. We are planting one on East Avenue between 42nd and 43rd where the water main project took place. Planting will be done in the middle of October. At 4143 Home we will plant a Maple, at 4129 Wisconsin will get a Maple, 4401 Maple will get an Oak and 4245 Gunderson will get an Oak. This is our Ten-Year Tree City Anniversary.

<u>Trustee Torres</u>: She announced the Pet Fest on September 16th, and the Haunted Hayride and pumpkin patch on October 21. We will have a paper shredding event on August 19th for residents only. Flyers were sent in the mail.

<u>Trustee Hrejsa</u>: Our Family Day is September 3. It includes fireworks. Volunteers are needed.

The Mayor reminded the audience of Music in the Park this Wednesday. Little League is cooking. The bands have been extended for two more weeks.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

Public Works Supervisor Joe Lopez: We have our annual shredding event on August 19th for Stickney residents only. He explained that Waste Management locks it in a bid and takes it away for the shredding. We get a certificate as to how much we collected. Last year it was the most collected ever. Small electronic appliances can be brought to this event as well. He thanked the Board for the beautiful new truck. It is currently being outfitted for the snowplow. In addition, there is a wet land area for planting. We sought assistance from resident Mr. Kotnor who is a horticulturist. He helped make the planting suggestions to revitalize the area. At a later time, we will be placing signage identifying the names of the plants. These plants are attractive to bees and butterflies.

<u>Police Chief James Sassetti:</u> Reported that the recent open house on August 5^{th} of the police station had close to 300 people attending. He thanked those from the police department and other departments that helped out. Trustee Hrejsa helped out with the balloons. During the month of July, we responded to 2128 calls. This was our highest call volume yet. We are constantly seeing our call volume increase. All the new squad cars that we have purchased since the 4^{th} quarter of last year have been delivered, striped and outfitted. You will start seeing the entire fleet of white squad cars on the street. We are thinning them out and using them less in order to give us more longevity to stay within the warranty period and keep the miles down.

He then provided the bad news. The Cook County Department of Transportation will start redoing the Central Avenue bridge. It is estimated to be a two-year project. Commencing on September 1st the Central bridge will be down to one lane of traffic in each direction. They will be narrow ten-foot lanes. It is creating a huge public safety impairment for us. He directed our four Watch Commanders to put together an action response plan for incidents that happen on the Central bridge. If there is an accident we will not be able to get to it. We encourage you to avoid the Central bridge for the next two years. We may have to go to Cicero Avenue or Harlem Avenue and circle back to get to people who are injured in accidents. The on and off ramps will be one lane also. Our dispatch will direct non-injury accidents and will instruct people to go directly to the police station. We will not even send police there. It is only one way up and one way down. He encouraged everybody to avoid the Central bridge. You should have received a card in the mail alerting you to this construction project.

We will do some Facebook and some other things to let our residents know. They are putting up temporary lights. Go to Harlem. IDOT will do the snow removal on Central during this construction.

Fire Chief Jeff Boyajian: He has been in communication with the chiefs in surrounding communities to come up with a plan for responses on the top of the Central bridge. It effects ambulances from Chicago going to MacNeal. They will have to reroute Central Stickney and Bedford Park. We have been in contact with them that it is coming. They should use Cicero or Harlem for responses. Depending on where it is located on the bridge, we would respond from the north and Forest View will respond from the south. We were updated on the UTV that the Board approved to purchase, it is now 98% completed. It is sitting out front of the Village Hall for people to view. It is nicely lettered and has its lights on. The only thing it is missing is the patient transport carrier in the back.

There being no further business, Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Savopoulos that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which the Board adopted the motion at 7:47 p.m.

The low bid was submitted by Lindahl Brothers, Inc. submitting a bid in the amount of \$455,130.58, which is \$78,025.82 (-14.63%) below the Engineer's Estimate of \$533,156.40.

Lindahl Brothers, Inc. is qualified to perform work on this project. Therefore, we recommend that the Contract be awarded to Lindahl Brothers, Inc. 622 E Green Street, Bensenville, IL 60106, in the amount of \$455,130.58.



A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING AN ARBITRATION AGREEMENT IN THE MATTER OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY AND THE ILLINOIS FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE LABOR COUNCIL FOR THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, as a home rule unit of local government the Village may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Fraternal Order of Police Labor Council (the "Union") filed a Grievance against the Village relating to the termination of Heather Miller (the "Grievant"), known as FCMS Case No. 110103-00213A "Miller Back Pay Arbitration" Arb. Docket No. 110504 (the "Litigation"); and

WHEREAS, the Grievant alleges suffering certain damages resulting from her termination from the Village (the "Claims"); and

WHEREAS, the Grievant sought damages from the Village for the Claims; and

WHEREAS, the Village does not admit any wrongdoing on its part or on the part of any of its current or former employees, officers or officials, but the Grievant and the Village (together, the "Parties") wish to settle these matters to avoid protracted litigation and the costs associated therewith; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to avoid further controversy, costs, legal fees, inconvenience and any future litigation regarding any issue contained in or arising from the Litigation, the Village, on one hand, and the Grievant, on the other hand, have agreed to resolve the Litigation as to all Parties in accordance with the terms set forth in Arbitration Agreement (the "Agreement"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to agree to the terms of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the President is authorized to enter into and the Village Attorney (the "Attorney") is authorized to revise agreements for the Village making such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the President and the Attorney;

AGREEMENT

NOW COME the Parties hereto, the Village of Stickney (including its Police Department), the Illinois Fraternal Order of Police Labor Council ("Union"), and the Grievant, Heather Miller, and in order to effectuate the Arbitrator's April 6, 2023, Award (hereafter "Award"), and enter into this Agreement.

WHEREAS, on April 6, 2023, the Arbitrator issued a Remedy Award in this matter, setting out in general terms of the appropriate remedy in this case.

WHEREAS, the Arbitrator found the Grievant, Heather Miller, was entitled to the following remedies from the Village:

- 1. "[P]ension credits based upon her seniority from the date of hire, as part of this remedy award."
- 2. Annual Education Bonus.
- 3. Backpay between the date of the Grievant's termination until the date that is one year after the date that the Grievant stopped receiving unemployment benefits, offset by any unemployment compensation that the Grievant received and less two weeks' pay to be considered a disciplinary suspension (hereafter, the "Backpay Period").
- 4. Overtime pay during the Backpay Period.
- 5. Holiday pay during the Backpay Period.
- 6. Any other pay the Grievant would have earned during the Backpay Period.

WHEREAS, the Award acknowledges that the Grievant had already been paid for vacation and sick time. The Award provided that monies would be due for "Paid Time Off" only if "the Parties have routinely compensated employees for unused Personal Days," and the Parties report that there has been no such routine practice;

WHEREAS, the Award provided that Union dues were to be deducted from the monies owed to the Grievant and those sums were to be forwarded to the Union;

WHEREAS, the Award did not specify the specific sums of money owed for the foregoing categories of relief, denied all other relief sought, and concluded that the Arbitrator retains jurisdiction to resolve any issues arising under the Award; and

WHEREAS, the Village denies that it violated the collective bargaining agreement entered into between the Parties or any wrongdoing whatsoever, and specifically denies the allegations set forth in the Grievance;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration for the mutual promises and other consideration identified herein, which all Parties agree is adequate and sufficient consideration, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Each of the Parties agree to the statements and terms contained in the Supplemental/Clarified Order attached hereto as Exhibit A, and agree to cooperate with each other to submit Exhibit A and this Agreement to the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund ("IMRF") in order to obtain IMRF approval of the mechanism to effectuate pension credits for the Grievant based upon the back pay payment.
- 2. Once Exhibit A and this Agreement are both preliminarily approved by IMRF, the Parties shall use their best and good faith efforts to ask the Arbitrator to enter the Supplemental/Clarified Order attached hereto as Exhibit A.

- 3. If IMRF or the Arbitrator seek modifications of the non-monetary terms of this Agreement or Exhibit A, the Parties shall negotiate in good faith to seek to reach agreement regarding any such modifications. However, the Parties agree that the monetary terms contained in Exhibits A1 and A2 have been agreed upon by the Parties and the Parties shall have no obligation to renegotiate the monetary terms.
- 4. After the Arbitrator enters the Supplemental/Clarified Order attached as Exhibit A, the Village shall comply with the Supplemental/Clarified Order by reinstating the Grievant and immediately placing her on an unpaid leave of absence.
- 5. During the period of the Grievant's reinstatement/leave of absence, she shall have no duties or responsibilities for the Village, other than executing any required W-4 forms, and except for IMRF, the Grievant shall not hold herself out to third parties as being an employee of the Village.
- 6. During the period of the Grievant's reinstatement/leave of absence from the Village, she shall not be entitled to receive any compensation or any benefits from the Village, except as specifically provided in this Supplemental/Clarified Award.
- 7. Once the Village forwards pension contributions to IMRF relating to the Grievant pursuant to the calculations attached as Exhibit A2, the Grievant's employment relationship with the Village shall be terminated, and the termination shall not be subject to any grievance or arbitration provision of any Collective Bargaining Agreement in effect between the Village and the Union, nor shall Grievant be entitled to recover any other employment-related benefits relating to the reinstatement/leave of absence period, including, but not limited to unemployment benefits, as a result of the termination.
 - 8. The Parties Agree that the termination of the Grievant's employment that is planned

following the pension payments will be for legitimate and non-discriminatory reasons and is part of the Parties' efforts to effect the remedy Award.

- 9. The Grievant hereby covenants not to sue the Village for any claim relating to her reinstatement, leave of absence or the planned termination of her employment with the Village, or bring any other action challenging the propriety of the leave of absence or her discharge. However, nothing contained in this Agreement prohibits the Grievant from filing an action to enforce the Supplemental/Clarified Award or communicating with any government agency, filing a complaint with a government agency, or otherwise participating in any investigation or proceeding that may be conducted by any government agency. This Agreement also does not limit the Grievant's right to receive only a reward from a government-administered reward program for providing information directly to a government agency; however, the Grievant further waives any right to any form of damages (including, but not limited to lost wages, compensatory damages, liquidated damages, or punitive damages), hiring or reinstatement, attorneys' fees and costs, or other remedy in any action brought by the Grievant or on her behalf relating to her planned separation from the Village or to any claim relating to any terms or conditions of employment during the term of her reinstatement not specifically addressed herein.
- 10. The Union and the Grievant agree that the Village's compliance with the terms of the Supplemental/Clarified Award shall be full and complete satisfaction of the April 6, 2023 Award and shall fully and completely resolve all issues that were addressed in or relating to the Grievance that was the basis for the April 6, 2023 Award.
- 11. This Agreement is being entered into solely for the purpose of resolving disputed claims and shall not be construed as: (a) an admission by the Village of any (i) liability or wrongdoing to the Union or to the Grievant, (ii) breach of any agreement, or (iii) violation of a

statute, law, or regulation; or (b) a waiver of any defenses as to those matters within the scope of this Agreement. Similarly, this Agreement shall not be construed as an admission by the Union or the Village of any wrongdoing or violation of the CBA.

12. The Grievant acknowledges and represents that throughout this process she has been fully and fairly represented by the Union.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Union, the Grievant and the Village have signed and executed this Agreement on the dates indicated below and agree to be bound by its terms.
