ELECTRIC AGGREGATION:

Our Current Contract with Eligo Energy is going to expire at the end of September. We are working with Illinois Energy Aggregation to help us with the next contract. They helped

us with the last two. Unfortunately rates are on the rise. We are leaning toward going with Green Energy with Eligo. The rates will mirror Commonwealth Edison's rates for the terms of the contract. The brown energy rates that were presented to us still have the \$4.95 per month surcharge that we had on the last contract. When we do the math, even though Commonwealth Edison's rate fluctuates a couple of times a year, in the end the cost is about the same. By going with Eligo's Green Energy Program we would receive a grant of \$5000. The Village would be able to increase security at Edison and Home Schools with Cameras. The Village is planning to budget to match that grant with an additional \$5000 to make both of our Schools safer. I have been researching rates for the last couple of months. I found rates as high as 10.5 cents per kilowatt. There are many electric companies out there that offer a low rate for 6 months, and then go way up. Also if you want to opt out they have fees from \$50 to \$100. This Contract would be for a term of 20 months. As with all the contracts for electric that the Village has entered into, you can opt out anytime with no penalty. The Choice is yours.



I'm sure you have noticed our new Sign in the front of the Village Hall. We plan to advertise Community events for our Schools, churches, local charitable organizations, as well as our Village events. The Time and Temperature will always be displayed. We are all excited to add this sign to be able to let the residents know what is happening around Stickney. I hope you all enjoy the rest of your summer! Please remember as you drive around the town that kids will be back in school soon.

This year we have made some changes in our parking ordinances. These are the changes:

Designated parking zones are resident parking only. Residents must have their permit decals affixed to their vehicles in Zones W, A and E.

New visitor placards will be available to residents for overnight parking for guests of family. Each household can receive two. There is no parking in the Village without a current vehicle sticker from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m., except vehicles with a visible visitor parking placard

hanging on the rear view mirror. Caretakers will be allowed to use visitor placard or purchase a Village vehicle sticker to avoid parking tickets. The old parking passes are no longer valid. Exceptions can be made by contacting the Police Department for special events.

Permit parking for commercial vehicles will be allowed in a designated area in the back row of the Municipal Lot located at 6715-6717 Pershing Road with designated numbered parking spaces which corresponds with "permit-parking-only" numbered placard. The cost will be \$60.00 per year and are available to purchase at the Police Department. Class D plates will NOT be allowed to park on any Village street.

The Stickney Police Department is proud to announce that through the support of Mayor Jeff Walik and the Stickney Village Board members we have added a new vehicle to our fleet of police vehicles. This vehicle was obtained from drug asset forfeiture funds through the help of area drug dealers, and in return we help place those drug dealers in local prisons. Our new addition is an ATV (All-Terrain-Vehicle) known as a four wheeler, which will be used for patrolling the alleyways, residential areas, schools, businesses, and our parks. The ATV Vehicle helps to take our officers out of the enclosed police vehicles, and become more interactive with all our residents and promote public relations.

Many years ago police officers were assigned zones and walked the beat on foot, which made residents feel more secure and personal with officers, and the officers in return felt more committed to their assigned areas. This gave residents the opportunity to report crimes privately in their area, which were kept in confidence between that resident and that offi-

cer, while helping each other to keep the neighborhood safe. The officers riding the ATV programs will be used to The members of

help enhance community relationships, but not used for any pursuits or the handling of incoming service calls. We will be encouraging our police officers to take the time, while out patrolling on this ATV to stop and talk with our residents regarding any major concerns, which will be then addressed through other channels within the police department.

OMARI SILVERA

First I'd like to take this opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Omari Silvera and I am one of the Assistant Chiefs here at the Stickney Fire Department. I started my career as a firefighter here almost 17 years ago and was promoted to the rank of Assistant Chief in June of 2017. Later that year I was asked to oversee the operations of the fire prevention bureau.

The bureau has many functions that are an important part of the day to day operations in the village. Fire and Life Safety Code Enforcement is one of those functions and a very important part of what the bureau does for

the community. Enforcement of the code is achieved through regular inspections of all businesses, schools, healthcare facilities and multi-family residential properties in the village. Typically, a semi-annual inspection of all of these properties would ensure a safe environment for the occupants, owners and their patrons by preventing any unsafe condition from going unchecked for too long.

Should that inspection reveal any unsafe conditions or violations of the life safety or fire codes, a follow up visit or re-inspection of the property would be required. Furthermore, any new code violations found during re-inspection would also require a follow up visit. To put it more simply, a business or property with NO VIOLATIONS

would only see an inspector twice per year; about every 6 months. Properties with multiple code violations or ongoing safety issues would need to be re-inspected until all of the issues are resolved. This process can be very time consuming, lengthy and inefficient in terms of accomplishing our goal of ensuring a safe environment for the occupants of ALL of the

properties within the jurisdiction of the Fire Prevention Bureau.

Going forward, we hope to streamline the operations of the fire prevention bureau and the inspection process to better serve the community and accomplish our goals more efficiently. We will be implementing new technology to provide a more efficient inspection process from start to finish and effective this year we will be inspecting small businesses and multi-family properties only once per year. High hazard properties and farget Hazards" will continue to be inspected on a semi-annual basis. Please

"Target Hazards" will continue to be inspected on a semi-annual basis. Please remember that a re-inspection will be required should violations be present during the initial inspection.

Also, an inspection can be a very useful training tool for the Fire/EMS companies that would be responding to your business in an emergency. Whenever possible the on duty crew will accompany the inspector on inspections. This will allow them to gain access under calmer circumstances and become familiar with the interior layout of the property. This information also assists us with developing something called Pre-Plans which we use during emergency operations.

Finally, the Stickney Fire Department and the Fire Prevention Bureau considers the safety of you and the members of this department to be of the utmost importance. In fact, your safety and ours is the number one reason to maintain a properly functioning fire prevention bureau within the fire department. Public relations and communications are very important in order to maintain a safer community. The inspectors in the field will continue to operate with the highest level of professionalism and provide good customer service while enforcing the codes and ordinances of the Village of Stickney.

Document Destruction Day

On August 25th, the Village will be sponsoring a Document Destruction Event from 9:00 a.m. to noon. Waste Management will provide locked containers that will be used for the documents. We will have volunteers on site to assist you in depositing your documents into the locked containers. The containers will be hauled away by Waste Management and we will get a certificate confirming that all documents have been shredded. This event is for Stickney residents only and is limited to two copier boxes per resident.



Leaf Pick Up

Leaf Pick up will run the last week of October through the first week of December on Mondays and Tuesdays only. Leaves should be placed loose along the curb in front of resident's home. Follow the street sweeping signs on your block.

Monday: The North and West side (even side) Tuesday: The South and East side (odd side)

Vehicles may not be parked from 7:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. in front of the residence on the day of the designated pick up. All violators will be ticketed. PLEASE NOTE THAT THIS IS A SEPARATE PROGRAM FROM THE YARD WASTE DISPOSAL. IF YOU STILL CHOOSE TO BAG YOUR LEAVES THEY MUST BE PUT OUT ON YOUR YARD WASTE PICK UP DAY.

Snow Removal - What Happens When It Snows?

- 1) First, main streets and main intersections are plowed and salted. This would include Ridgeland, Oak Park, 40th, 41st, 42nd, 43rd, 44th and 45th, streets.
- 2) Next, all North and South streets and 40th place will be cleared
- 3) Public facilities which will include the parking area for businesses along Pershing Rd.
- 4) Parks and Bus stops
- 5) We do not do any snow removal on Pershing Rd. because it's a state route.

When snowfall measures two inches or more you must follow the snow removal signs posted at the beginning and towards the end of your block.

Snow Removal hours are from 8:00 a.m. - 11:00 p.m.


Public Works cannot be called to clear private property or driveways, and we are not responsible for rollover snow on driveway or sidewalks from snowplowing.


Please be courteous to your neighbors and motorists; DO NOT SHOVEL SNOW BACK INTO THE STREETS.

The owners and occupants of every house in the Village should have visible address numbers that are visible from the street. The figures should be $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches high showing the number of the house.

Every house which has an alley should also place in a location visible from the alley, address numbers 2½ inches high. Do not put the numbers on the overhead garage door. First Responders, Public Works, Waste Management and our Code Enforcement Officer need proper addresses to locate you.

- If the house has a garage which is closer to the alley than the house, the figures should be placed on the side of the garage closest to and parallel to the alley.
- If there is no garage and there is a fence parallel to and closer to the alley than the house, the figures should be
 placed on the fence.
- · If there is no garage and no fence the address numbers should be placed on the back of the house.

Failure to have proper visible address numbers on any house garage, fence or shed in the Village is subject to a fine.
