Vehicle Stickers and Pet Tags on sale May I



Vehicle stickers and Pet tags will go on sale starting May 1st – June 30th, 2020.

We will no longer mail out vehicle and pet renewal forms. We will have your information here at the Village Hall. If you are adding a new vehicle you will need to bring in your Illinois Secretary of State Vehicle registration form of the vehicle you are adding.

Application Fees:Senior Citizens (65 and over) - No charge
Handicap/All Veterans - No Charge
Passenger Car - \$20
Trucks – fee will vary depending on the license plate

*Veteran status can now be put on your driver's license through the Secretary of State.

Vehicle stickers must be displayed by July 1st. Late fees are an additional \$20.00 per vehicle. Your pet must have a current rabies vaccine number and expiration date in order to obtain a pet license. Late fees are an additional \$5.00 per pet.

The Village Hall is open until 7:00p.m. on Board Meeting days, May 5, May 19, June 2nd and June 16th. There will be additional hours on Tuesday, June 23rd until 7:00 p.m. and Saturday, June 27th from 9:00 a.m. to Noon.

The Census is an official count of the population that happens once every 10 years. The Census is mandated by the U.S. Constitution.

Answer your Census 2020 Questionnaire "Shape Your Future. Start here."

Your response to the Census will shape your future for the next ten years. The Census is currently in the Motivation/Participation phase which runs from March 13, 2020 until May 12, 2020. People are asked to complete the 2020 Census questionnaire online, by phone or by mail. The final Re-

minder phase will run from May 13, 2020 through June 28, 2020. Between May and July Census workers will begin visiting homes that haven't responded to make sure everyone is counted.

Don't forget to count EVERY person living in your house. Children under age 5 are one of the largest groups of undercounted people in the United States. Counting young children will be important in the 2020 Census because this population count is used by local, state, and federal lawmakers to determine how to spend billions of dollars in federal and state funds. Much of that money funds nutrition assistance (SNAP), Head Start, special education, foster care, Medicaid, and the Children's Health Insurance Program and housing assistance to help a child's family.

All information you provide is CONFIDENTIAL. By law they will NEVER share personal information with immigration agencies like ICE; law enforcement agencies, like the FBI or police; or allow it to be used to determine their eligibility for government benefits. Census Bureau employees are sworn to secrecy.

Be cautious of people posing as Census employees. Real Census employees won't ask for your full Social Security number, for money or donations, or for bank or credit card numbers. Check for their valid identification badge with his or her photograph, a Department of Commerce watermark and an expiration date.

WELCOME THE CENSUS INTO YOUR WORLD

According to the Illinois Department of Human Services, certain areas and populations are "Hard-To- Count." They include young children, immigrants, low-income and people of color. The failure to count every Illinois resident would have a devastating effect on Illinois' ability to meet the needs of its residents. Each person that doesn't respond costs the state \$1,400 in lost potential funding each year, or a total of \$14,000 over the next decade (until the next Census). Even a one-percent undercount would result in the State losing \$19,557,435 per year for a decade, resulting in a total loss of

\$195,574, 350.

Gran parte de ese dinero financia la asistencia nutricional (SNAP), Head Start, educación especial, cuidado de crianza, Medicaid y el Programa de seguro médico para niños y asistencia para vivienda para ayudar a la familia de un niño.

Toda la información que proporciones es CONFIDENCIAL. Por ley, NUNCA compartirán información personal con agencias de inmigración como ICE; agencias de aplicación de la ley, como el FBI o la policía; o permitir que se use para determinar su elegibilidad para beneficios del gobierno. Los empleados de la Oficina del Censo juran guardar el secreto.

Tenga cuidado con las personas que se hacen pasar por empleados del Censo. Según el Departamento de Servicios Humanos de Illinois, ciertas áreas y poblaciones son "difíciles de contar". Estas incluyen niños pequeños, inmigrantes, bajos ingresos y personas de color. No contar a todos los residentes de Illinois tendría un efecto devastador en la capacidad de Illinois para satisfacer las necesidades de sus residentes. Cada persona que no responde le cuesta al estado \$1,400 en fondos potenciales perdidos cada año, o un total de \$14,000 durante la próxima década (hasta el próximo Censo). Incluso un conteo insuficiente del uno porciento resultaría en que el Estado pierda \$19,557,435 cada año por una década, resultando en una pérdida total de \$195,574, 350.

Please call the library at 708-749-1050 to verify when the Spanish assistant will be on duty. The North Clinic Senior Center at 6721 W. 40th Street, has a computer lab on the lower level. They have scheduled lab times. There is no dedicated assistance available for the Census. The North Clinic phone number is 708-788-9100.

The Village of Stickney has ordinances in place that all businesses and multiunit/rental dwellings must have their property inspected by a licensed exterminator or pest control company for any evidence of rat harborage or infestation. They must also have bait boxes and those boxes must be re-baited at least twice a year.

I am going to talk about some of my dreams for Stickney. First on my list is a

Community Center. I hope in the future we will be able to receive funding for a place for activities and events to take place.

My second dream is for Stickney to have its own zip code. Our area is split between Berwyn and Cicero post offices. Everything on the east side of Ridgeland goes to the Cicero Post Office. Everything west of Ridgeland goes to the Berwyn Post Office. At one time we did have our own post office but then things changed.

One of the hot topics in our newsletter is the CENSUS. We need to drive home the need for responding. We lose \$14,000.00 per person over ten years if you do not respond. By not responding to the census this will affect our Federal funding for schools, libraries, roadways and other community needs.

From the Desk of Interim Police Chief **RICH JACZAK**

The Stickney Police Department continues to make strides in the right direction, with our ultimate goal to keep our residents, visitors, shoppers, and anyone else who may be in Stickney, safe. We recently welcomed back Officer Ricky Foytik. The SPD now has 19

full-time sworn officers which is the most we have ever had. Since 2017 we have hired seven new officers; all of whom are excelling. The hiring and retention of officers has only been possible with the support of Mayor Walik, the Village Board, and our residents. There are a few topics I'd like to share with you:

RECREATIONAL CANNABIS

Recreational cannabis has been legalized in Illinois, but there are still laws governing how much and where you can use it. In order to possess recreational cannabis, Illinois residents must be at least 21 years old and are limited to 30 grams leaf, 500 mg THC-infused products, and 5 grams cannabis concentrate. Cannabis in a vehicle must be in a sealed, odorproof, child-resistant container. Cannabis use is prohibited in any vehicle and any public place, which includes anywhere you can expect to be viewed by the public. Violators can be ticketed \$200-\$500 or be arrested.

TRAINING

Our police officers are more highly trained than ever. There is a lot of State mandated training that officers must complete once they are out of the police academy. Some can be completed on-line. We take monthly lessons thru "Police Law Institute" and upon passing exams receive certifications. However, some training must be completed in person. An example is "Crisis Intervention". Every police officer in Illinois must attend this week-long course once they have completed two years of service. By March all eligible SPD officers are scheduled to have taken the course. While this is burdensome to the department, having this training is essential based on the volume of mental health calls we respond to.

COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

PLEASE sign up for CodeRED. By logging on to the Village website (villageofstickney.com) and clicking on the logo in the upper right corner you can sign yourself up for community notifications. These alerts include upcoming community events, weather warnings, and other information such as when street cleaning is beginning for the year (April 1!). Your information remains confidential and will not be shared by the Village.

SPRING CLEANING:

Spring is here, it's time to take down the holiday decorations! Spring ordinance inspections for upkeep and maintenance of your property have begun. This includes maintaining your lawn,

keeping weeds and overgrown vegetation cut in your front and back yard and also behind and around your garage. Accumulation of junk, debris or litter on private or public property is not allowed. If you're storing wood, please keep it off the ground a minimum of 18" to prevent rodent problems.

EXCESS GARBAGE AND RECYCLING:

Overflowing garbage will result in a fine. DO NOT PUT EXCESS GARBAGE BAGS ON THE GROUND.

Excess garbage should be placed in a solid rigid container with handles that do not exceed 32-gallons in size and 50 lbs. in weight.

Do not put your garbage, recycling or yard waste out no later than 6:00 a.m. on your scheduled pick-up day. Remove your containers no later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of your pick up. It's a nuisance to leave any refuse containers out for days to be picked up. Tickets will be issued to anyone who does.

ATTENTION:

If you live in town and own a landscape business, be advised that you are not allowed to put out landscape yard waste for the village to pick up. We are paying close attention and if you are doing this, a citation and maximum \$500 fine will be issued along with a court date.

CONSTRUCTION PERMITS AND REMOVAL OF CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS:

If you are planning on remodeling the interior or exterior of your home or business make sure you apply for proper permits. Construction material or waste should be disposed of properly and should NOT be put out for the Village to take. It is the responsibility of the contractor or homeowner to have any construction materials removed. Any construction materials that are put out for Public Works to pick up will result in a ticket and fine. Any properties under construction of any kind are responsible for maintaining the area and keeping it completely clean of garbage and debris at all times. Failure to do so will be issued a ticket and daily fines along with an

adjudication court date.

GARAGE, YARD, ESTATE SALES

You will be allowed to put signs on public property, however they must be removed immediately after your sale or a citation will be given. Signs are NOT allowed on stop signs, light poles or street lights.

Failure to remove signs from public or private property shall constitute a violation and violators shall be subject to a \$50.00 minimum fine. You must be the homeowner to have a sale and only ONE permit is allowed per year.





GRAFFITI

Graffiti should be reported to the Police Department as soon as possible, however homeowners, business owners, management of companies and properties are responsible for removing the graffiti. Graffiti should be removed within fifteen (15) days from the date it occurred.

NO PARKING

• No parking on soft surfaces is allowed, in your yard, on the grass or dirt on public or private property.

ALL ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS ARE SUBJECT TO A FINE UP TO \$500.

Stickney Pavilion

Splash Pad at O'Reilly Park

On the hot summer days Kids can cool off running through sprouting mushrooms, shooting water cannons and traipsing through geysers. The Splash Pad is open from Memorial Day to Labor Day (weather permitting) and is free for all.

Bruscato Dog Park

Bruscato Dog Park is a great place to let your dog off the leash! One affordable membership allows you access into the large dog park year-round. Street Cleaning will start the first Monday & Tuesday of April and will run thru December and will continue thru out the year weather

permitting. Parking restrictions will be in affect during this time on Mondays and Tuesdays from 8:00 a.m. – 5:00p.m. and are as follows:

The Census information helps to provide Federal money for things such as SNAP, Head Start, special education, foster care, Medicaid, Senior Assistance, and the Children's Health Insurance.





From the Desk of Fire Chief JEFFREY BOYAJIAN

Springtime is upon us again and I would like to let you know about the importance of smoke detectors and the right placement in your homes.

Smoke detectors save lives. Smoke detectors that are properly installed and maintained play a vital role in reducing fire deaths and injuries. If there is a fire in your home, smoke spreads fast and you need smoke detectors to give you time to get out.

The Illinois' Smoke Detector Act requires a smoke detector within 15 feet of every sleeping room. Smoke detectors must be 4-6 inches from the wall if mounted to a ceiling. Smoke detectors need to be on every level of a home, except unoccupied attics. A new State law which goes

into effect January 1, 2023 requires all of you to have a smoke detector with built-in batteries that last for 10 years. Hardwired smoke detectors do not need to be replaced.

Here's what you need to know!

- A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat and fire. Install smoke detectors in every sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. Install detectors on every level of the home.
- If possible, smoke detectors should be interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound.
- Large homes may need extra smoke detectors.
- Test your smoke detectors at least once a month. Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working.
- Today's smoke detectors will be more technologically advanced to respond to a multitude of fire conditions yet mitigate false detections.
- When a smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside.
- Replace all smoke detectors in your home every 10 years.
- In 2017 there were an estimated 371,500 residential fires in the United States with the following being the highest percentage of causes;
 - o 51.6% Cooking
 - o 9.1% Heating
 - o 7.1% Unintentional/Careless
 - o 6.5% Electrical

Have an escape Plan

Make a home escape plan. Draw a map of each level of the home. Show all doors and windows. Discuss the plan with everyone in your household, including visitors. Go to each room and point to the two ways out. Practice the plan with everyone in your household, including visitors. Post the plan in your home, on your refrigerator or a cork board.

Home Fire Safety-

If your smoke alarm sounds or you discover a fire, try not to panic, tell everyone in the house. Use your pre-planned escape route, get everyone out of the building as quickly as possible. Remember that smoke rises, so stay low or crawl on the floor in the cleaner air where it is easier to breathe. Do not stop to collect valuables, possessions or look for pets. If possible, close the door to the room where the fire is located and close all doors behind you as you leave, this helps delay the spread of fire. Before opening a closed door, touch it with the back of your hand, do not open if it feels warm-the fire will be on the other side. Find somewhere safe near the building and wait for the fire department to arrive. If someone is still inside, tell the fire department and give them details as to where they might be located. DO NOT GO BACK INTO the building as this increases the risk of injury or death.

Annual Fire Prevention Practices

- o Keep clutter at least 3 feet away from any heating source, (furnace, water heater, fireplace, etc.)
- o Clean your dryer screen after every use, clean area around dryer and vacuum the dryer vent at least once a year
- o Keep flammable liquids stored away from the house in a proper container and in a well-ventilated area out of direct sunlight
